WORD

Peter's sermon, delivered at the home of Cornelius, a Roman army officer, is a summary of the essential message of Christianity: Everyone who believes in Jesus, whose life, death, and resurrection fulfilled the words of the prophets, "receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43

The First reading is from the 10th chapter of Acts.

THE LESSON READS:

Peter began to speak to [the people]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Easter means new life for us as it first meant new life for Christ. His resurrection reshapes the entire focus and motivation for our lives, since we are now hidden with the risen Christ in God.

SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-4

The Second reading is from the 3rd chapter of Colossians.

THE LESSON READS:

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on

earth, ³for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

NURSE'S NOTES – Five ways to "stay comfortable" on the go with Laptop Ergonomics:

- Get your keyboard at a comfortable angle. Prop the back of the laptop on a small book, or purchase an angled lap desk.
- Make the screen brighter. Dim screens save battery life, but you'll get a headache staring at a low contrast screen.
- Use a separate mouse. Touchpads may be clumsy to use for extended periods.
- Position the laptop for the task at hand. If you are doing a lot of typing, your wrists should be straight and elbows at a 90-degree angle, as if you were typing on a keyboard in the office. If you are mainly reading, elevate it to near eye level (put it on a stack of books or magazines).
- Carry it in comfort. Your laptop, mouse, power supply, and other accessories
 probably weigh from 5 to 10 pounds. Be sure to carry it all in a bag so that the weight
