CHIMES: CALL TO WORSHIP PRELUDE [A Time for Meditation and Prayer] GREETINGS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS INTRODUCTION

In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. Through this great epiphany, Jesus fulfills all righteousness and becomes the servant of God who will bring forth justice and be a light to the nations. In the waters of baptism we too are washed by the Word, anointed by the Spirit, and named God's beloved children. Our baptismal mission is to proclaim good news to all who are oppressed or in need of God's healing.

- * SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM
 - P In Holy Baptism our gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

Parents: We present Grace Rosalie Miller to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

P Grace Rosalie Miller do you desire to be baptized?

Parents: I do.

P In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring her to the services of God's house, and teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As she grows in years, you should place in her hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for her instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of his Baptism and in communion with the Church, she may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.

Do you promise to fulfill these obligations?

Parents: Yes, by the help of God.

P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things.

By the waters of the flood you condemmed the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that they who are here baptized may be given new life. Wash away the sin of those who are cleansed by this water and bring them forth as inheritors of your glorious kingdom.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Peter crosses the sharp religious boundary separating Jews from Gentiles and proclaims the good news of God's inclusive forgiveness in Jesus' name to Cornelius, a Roman centurion. As a result of Peter's preaching, Cornelius and his family become the first Gentiles to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

SECOND READING

A reading from Acts 10:34-43

THE LESSON READS:

³⁴Then Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

ON SUNDAY, JANUARY 16th, we will welcome Dr. Todd Taylor as a guest speaker during our morning worship service at Messiah. Todd is the creator of Houses of Hope for Haiti here in Juniata County. The vision of the Houses of Hope for Haiti program is to respond in God's love to provide basic housing for Haitian families who lost their homes during the earthquake in January of 2010.

In February of 2010, Dr. Taylor was blessed to be able to go to Haiti with a group of eight other people to provide medical care. As they transitioned back to the U.S., they realized that a huge priority for the people of Haiti was housing. Without a roof over their heads, many were at risk for many diseases, infections, and death. This group was looking at forming a local group to start to build temporary housing. The initial contact was made with a group in Ohio that was way ahead of the game, was producing temporary housing, and had already shipped to Haiti. The group's initial plan was two-tiered. First, if people felt the immediate need to do something they could donate directly to the Haiti cabins group. Second, the group was actively recruiting local contractors, storage shed businesses, lumber supply companies, skilled carpenters and more. With this tier, they planned to build the houses locally and ship these along with the houses built by the group from Ohio.

During the morning worship service on January 16th, Todd will share his experiences with us and how God has worked in his life since, and how God's spirit has shown itself in Juniata County by those helping out with the Houses of Hope for Haiti program.
