The last Sunday of April we heard the story of doubting Thomas and Jesus two appearances to the disciples as they were locked in the room hiding in fear for their lives from the religious powers of the day. In these events we learn many things important to us and our ability to overcome our fears surrounding our attempts to bear witness to God.

It is God who has called you and God gives you the power of Christ's Spirit for the task. Even in trial and tribulation, "Peace be with you."

We are now in the midst of the season of Easter. During this season we have a series of readings from the Gospels related to the resurrection of Jesus and the mission he gave to his disciples to carry out.

The last Sunday of April we heard the story of doubting Thomas and Jesus two appearances to the disciples as they were locked in the room hiding in fear for their lives from the religious powers of the day. Reading that story we can discover for ourselves strength to overcome our own fears of bearing witness to Christ.

Following the resurrection the disciples were paralyzed with fear. They are fulfilling the struggle Jesus had warned them about at the end of John 16 where Jesus offers them his peace but warns them of the trials and tribulations of the days ahead. He then begins his prayer to his Father in the hearing of the disciples defining how he connects them to the Father and that he has made known to them God's work in the world. With all of this given and revealed to them they are still hiding in that room.

Jesus comes into the room and offers to them the same peace he did at the end of chapter 16. He shows them his wounds giving evidence to the cross and his crucifixion and then offering peace yet again he breathes his Spirit upon them and gives them a sending call.

A week later we find the disciples still in the same room. Thomas had not been with them earlier and their initial attempt to witness to him concerning the resurrection cannot be called successful. Thomas resists their testimony proclaiming he will not believe until he sees for himself.

Then Christ appears again proclaiming his peace to the group and offering himself to Thomas. In that moment Thomas is moved to confession "My Lord and my God," and faith is born. Jesus then asserts a new blessing upon all those who will believe because of those bear witness to the resurrection. "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe."

In these events we learn many things important to us and our ability to overcome our fears surrounding our attempts to bear witness to God.

- 1 Bearing witness to Christ and his grace is our calling as Christians. It is God given work.
- 2 Jesus himself intercedes with the Father for us in this work. (John 17)
- 3 Jesus repeatedly assures us that we receive his peace in the midst of our fears.
- 4 Jesus gives us the presence and power of his Spirit for this work extending his grace.
- 5 Not every attempt to bear witness will be successful. Thomas did not respond to the disciples initial witness.
- 6 Many will be blessed with the gift of faith confessing Christ as Lord despite not seeing.
- 7 Our calling is to simply bear witness and to allow the Spirit of Christ to bring forth faith wherever he wills.

Our task then is clear; we are called to manifest God's grace and forgiveness in the world and to give testimony to Christ's power in our lives. Do not be afraid. It is God who has called you and God gives you the power of Christ's Spirit for the task. Even in trial and tribulation, "Peace be with you."

We discussed several options and Claire will look into one of the options first.

It is a fun and informative morning and afternoon and we are home between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. Please see Barb Geedey for registration forms if you are interested in attending or have questions pertaining to the event. The cost is \$40.00 for a brunch and lunch plus the use of the facility and speakers.

The In-kind gift this year are items for the Personal Care Kits to send to Lutheran World Relief. Messiah has been asked to bring nail clippers and we will be collecting them sometime before August 2.

There were 10 women present and we closed with our Purpose Statement.

Our next meeting will be held on May 8, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. in the church basement. The program will be led by Ann Beaver. Any women of the church are welcome to attend the meetings.

Collection continues for Lutheran World Relief baby care kits. Items needed are:

--2 long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers

(without feet)

- --2 receiving blankets—medium weight cotton or flannel, crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn (up to 52" square)
- --4 cloth diapers (flat fold preferred)
- --1 jacket, sweater (with buttons or ties down front), or sweatshirt with a hood, or (include a baby cap)
- --2 pairs of socks
- --1 hand towel (dark color recommended)
 - --2 bath-size bars (4-5 oz.) of gentle soap in original wrapping
 - --2 diaper pins

WELCA Project for Friends of Pine Ridge Reservation for anyone who would like to help. Items needed are:

Toddler pants, teen p-j bottoms, sleepware for all ages, sun dresses and shorts, shirts and blouses, diaper bags, crib quilts, stuffed toys, bibs, cute colorful pillowcases, twin size bed sheets, crib sheets, Pack 'n Play size sheets, etc., sewn tote bags, knited or crocheted crib and smaller size baby blankets or afghans, slippers, cute scarves for the teens, mittens for the little ones, baby hats, booties, bunting, etc. Any colors, fibers and fabrics will work for any of the items that are made. The only restriction is (nothing with an owl print) as owls are a symbol of death in the Lakota culture.

Juniata County Food Pantry May Update

THANK YOU for the huge response to our plea for help! Our last update was a bit bleak, but YOU answered our prayers and helped us end March on a positive note.

In March, the Food Pantry served 351 families for a total of 1069 of your neighbors! Special thanks to Lower Tuscarora Presbyterian Church for sending volunteers for March.

We are very excited to be gearing up for our **Summer Backpack Program!** We provide students in grades K-8 with a backpack, which they can bring in once per week all summer long, and fill with a week' worth of nutritious lunches, including fresh produce! To qualify, students must be eligible for free or reduced lunches and/or have an ACCESS card. Even though summer is a wonderful time of year, having the kids home from school can put an added strain on already-tight food budgets. Students must pre-register. Students do NOT have to be current FOOD PANTRY clients. Last year we served approximately 165 students, and we anticipate that number will double this year!
