WORD

The visionary message presented in this reading focuses on a future day when God establishes a universal reign of peace. Divine decisions will make war obsolete, and the worshiping community responds: "Let us walk in that light of that Lord now!"

FIRST READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

The First Lesson is from the 2nd chapter of Isaiah.

THE LESSON READS:

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. ²In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. ³Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. ⁵O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!

Paul compares the advent of Christ to the coming of dawn. We live our lives today in light of Christ's coming in the future.

SECOND READING: Romans 13:11-14

The Second Lesson is from the 13th chapter of Romans.

THE LESSON READS:

¹¹Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; ¹²the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; ¹³let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

MESSIAH HERALD – At the October 10th meeting of the Board of Worship and Music, it was determined, and backed up by PPC, that, beginning with the January 2011 edition, the Messiah Herald newsletter will continue to be published monthly. However the delivery will be different. Due to declining mailing numbers, we will no longer be eligible for a U.S. Postal Service annual mailing permit for bulk rate. However, on the positive side, this will save us \$185 annually, plus an approximate \$37 charge each month for mailing the newsletter,

totaling around \$630 in savings each year.
