The First Lesson is from the 34th chapter of Ezekiel.

THE LESSON READS:

¹¹For thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. ¹²As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. 131 will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. 141 will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. 151 myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord GOD. 161 will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them with justice. ²⁰Therefore, thus says the Lord GOD to them: I myself will judge between the fat sheep and the lean sheep. ²¹Because you pushed with flank and shoulder, and butted at all the weak animals with your horns until you scattered them far and wide, 221 will save my flock, and they shall no longer be ravaged; and I will judge between sheep and sheep. ²³I will set up over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he shall feed them: he shall feed them and be their shepherd. ²⁴And I, the LORD, will be their God, and my servant David shall be prince among them; I, the LORD, have spoken.

CAR ACCIDENT – Early Sunday morning, November 2, Messiah was struck by a car. Tom Metz, a structural engineer, was called by George Hazard and he declared the building to be structurally safe. Red Rock Construction repaired all the damage at no cost to the church.

CHURCH TREASURER NEED – Messiah has a position opening for church treasurer. Requirements are: the position of church treasurer must be held by an adult member of the congregation. - 1. Recording the congregational receipts and disbursements.
- 2. Suggest improved methods and systems for financial record keeping.
- 3. Present a written financial report for Voters' Assembly meetings and PPC meetings.
- 4. Submit permanent financial records for an annual audit.
- 5. Pay salaries and bills as authorized by the congregation or Directors of Boards.
- 6. Coordinate the flow of monies from the treasury in a balanced manor.
- 7. Oversee the signing of all checks for payment of bills, salaries or other commitments of the congregation.
