WORD

MESSIAH HERALD – At the October 10th meeting of the Board of Worship and Music, it was determined, and backed up by PPC, that, beginning with the January 2011 edition, the <u>Messiah Herald</u> newsletter will continue to be published monthly. However the delivery will be different. Due to declining mailing numbers, we will no longer be eligible for a U.S. Postal Service annual mailing permit for bulk rate.
