

WELCA met on Thursday, July 9 at 7:00 p.m. The program was presented by Cynthia Smith. Ann Beaver presided over the business meeting (thank you Ann and Cynthia). Items discussed were the Farm Project which has currently collected \$488.58. The scarves which have been knitted can be sent with the Seafarers' Project as long as there is a hat to match. Linda Leister has directions for a hat which some of us can work on between now and when the items go to Synod in the fall. We are planning to begin our knitting again in the fall with a dishcloth and possibly hats. Seafarers Project – Items needed are: sweatshirts (preferably hooded sizes L-XL), thermal or white gym socks (no dress socks), casual pull-over T-shirts sizes M-L, and heavy knit winter caps. Place items on the table in the Adult Sunday School Room.

We are now collecting items for our School Kits as sales are now in progress. Items needed are 4—70 sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper 8" X  $10\frac{1}{2}$ ", one 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other, one pencil sharpener, one pair of blunt scissors, 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, 5 ballpoint pens, one box of 16 or 24 crayons, and one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " eraser. The items should be placed on the round table in the Adult Sunday School Room.

Family Farm Project – Raising money for ELCA Good Gifts and in particular, a Family Farm. Cost of the Family Farm is \$715.00 and will provide a cow, goats, a dozen chicks, two pigs, farming tools, agricultural training and marketing support. Checks or cash will be accepted. The teacher recruitment for Children's and Youth Sunday School continues, but now at a stepped-up pace. As to be expected, summer is a difficult time to contact people because many are away from home on a long anticipated vacation. There are also those candidates who legitimately need time to think and pray prior to making the commitment to be a Sunday School teacher. To join the church school faculty is an important step not to be taken lightly. Not only is a steady dedication demanded, but in most cases this church job brings with it the need to reassess and reprioritize one's personal life.



Preparation and teaching both demand personal time, and bv necessity, a spiritual commitment such as this now must compete with routine secular activities.

On September 1, 2015 radio stations WJUN-FM Country 92.5 & WLZS-FM Wheels 106.1 will be leaving their studios in Mexico, Juniata County and moving to Lewistown and will be rebranded as Bigfoot Country 92 and Bigfoot Country 106.

When this move was announced it left Juniata County high school sports without a local radio home, and, in order to fill this gap Steve Harris, Seth Hart (Shane Nelson), Pete Primak, and Central PA Alerts administrators have teamed up to form Juniata County Radio. This will make Juniata County sports available worldwide the Internet via on www.juniatacountyradio.com while also keeping a radio station in Juniata County. The site is a long way from being finished; however, it will be up and running by the time high school sports begin in September. Once the sports portion of the site is up and running, a permanent Country Music and Oldies station will be More details will be made added. available as the site is developed. In June 2015, the Food Pantry served 374 families in need – a total of 1009 individuals!
