WORD

In 597 B.C., the priest Ezekiel was removed into exile in Babylon. While there, he received a vision of God appearing majestically on a chariot throne. Today's reading recounts God's commissioning of Ezekiel during this vision. The prophet is to speak God's word to a people unwilling to hear.

A reading from Ezekiel 2:1-5

THE LESSON READS:

¹[A voice] said to me: O mortal, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you. ²And when he spoke to me, a spirit entered into me and set me on my feet; and I heard him speaking to me. ³He said to me, Mortal, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to a nation of rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have transgressed against me to this very day. ⁴The descendants are impudent and stubborn. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, "Thus says the Lord GOD." ⁵Whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house), they shall know that there has been a prophet among them.

THE LESSON READS:

²I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. ³And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows—⁴was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. ⁵On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, ⁷even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, ⁹but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

THE CONGREGATIONAL PICNIC will be held on Sunday, July 12, 2015 beginning with the worship service at the Mifflintown Playground followed by the picnic lunch. Mark the date on your calendar. Details will be in upcoming bulletins.

JUMP START BLOG: As we progress in "jump starting" children's and youth Sunday School at Messiah, the members of the Board of Christian Education have contacted all the parents of age eligible children and secured their commitment to support a Sunday School by assuring their children attend regularly. We believe over 30 children are to be enrolled! At our June 17th meeting some vital Sunday School dynamics were addressed:

- 1. After lengthy discussion it was agreed that the traditional time for Sunday School will remain at 9:15 to 10:15 AM.
- 2. Sunday School will break during the summer and restart in the fall for the obvious reason of allowing time for both children and teachers to regenerate.
- 3. We hope to have four classes: Nursery, K-2nd, 3rd-5th, 6th-12th. These cut-offs always involve a compromise of sorts. Our decisions were based on the actual numbers and ages of our children, the ease of adapting materials to span the ages, and the dynamic of older children opting for catechism training.
- 4. Our goal is to have TWO teachers assigned to each class so as to provide flexibility for them and ward off "burn-out."
- 5. There will be a facilitator (or head teacher) to test the pulse of the workings of the Sunday School who can identify trouble spots and either eliminate them or refer them to the Board for resolution.
- 6. Act 34 was discussed. This is the new PA law that requires background checks for public school teachers and any volunteers directly interacting with children. Sunday School teachers fall under the umbrella of this law. Across the State hundreds of thousands of people will have to comply the greater number have complied already. The Governor has recently waived the costs of these checks for the vast majority of volunteers involved. Like the rest of the churches in the commonwealth, we will have to comply a sign of our times.

7. We will soon be recruiting teachers by way of personal contacts. EVERYONE in the congregation should have a "church job." Being a Sunday School teacher is this and MUCH MORE. It is a calling and a privilege. It will require commitment and dedication. It is vital to the health of our church and to the spiritual growth of the next generation.
