As we are in the midst of Lent it is good to remind ourselves of the spiritual opportunities and insights the season affords us.

The season of Lent is often thought of as a season of repentance, a season of letting go sinful behaviors and self improvement, a season of turning away from sin.

But instead of turning away from our sinful self desires with no clear orientation or idea of where we are turning to we should be turning <u>to God</u> and his wisdom and insight for our lives.

How does this happen?

This Lent join us and start now discovering ways to learn about and to receive this new life, every day and every way. Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we are now in the midst of Lent it is good to remind ourselves of the spiritual opportunities and insights the season affords us. Taking hold of these opportunities can help us to grow in our walk with Christ.

The season of Lent is often thought of as a season of repentance, a season of letting go sinful behaviors. This then becomes for many a kind of spiritual New Year celebration where we give up things or make sacrifices like a series of end of winter resolutions. Too often these ideas are more self serving rather than Christ serving.

The word metanoia is the Greek word translated in the New Testament as repent or repentance. Most often it is focused on as turning away from our sinfulness and sinful behaviors. In contrast the opposite is true. It is more of a turning to something, specifically, turning to God. Metanoia in its root meanings from the Greek means to receive or to have a higher mind or higher knowing. It is to be filled with the will and knowledge of God.

So instead of turning away from our sinful self desires with no clear place or idea of where we are turning to we instead are turning to God and his wisdom and insight for our lives. Beginning with his baptism by John in the Jordan and the temptations in the wilderness our Lenten lessons points us to God and as our source or life and knowledge of how to live in a hostile and dangerous world.

Consider this example. A person struggling with addiction may know their life is in complete chaos, broken and not working. They may again and again attempt to stop abusing drugs or whatever in their life holds them captive. Again and again they fail and return to their physical, emotional and spiritual captivity. In the insights above we can expect this failure because they are only attempting to turn away from something; they are not turning to anything.

Metanoia points us and the addict instead to the idea of turning towards God and trusting God's love is sufficient to free us, keep us and hold us safe from our past and our failures. Metanoia means finding a higher knowledge and allowing that new way to become our way.

How does this happen? It can happen through reading scripture privately. It can be by participating in Bible Study and Sunday School. It can be through conversations with people like pastors. And it can be through rededicating ourselves to participating in worship and the means of grace like remembering or baptism in confession and receiving God's forgiveness in the promises of the Lord's Supper.

One thing I can promise you is that if you are truly repentant in the sense of metanoia it must be about receiving a new mind and a higher wisdom. Simply trying to walk away for our past and our sins is a recipe for failure because it receives nothing new. Only God who is the source and power of all creation makes things new. He promises us a new heaven and a new earth and that you are, also, made new in Christ.

This Lent start now discovering ways to learn about and to receive this new life, every day and every way. Grace and peace to you from the one who makes all things new.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

<u>Cleaning Angel</u> – Person with a God-given talent for cleaning and organizing. Approximately 4-6 hours per week. Possible days: Monday AM or PM; Thursday AM; Saturday PM.

<u>Computer Program Specialist</u> – Person knowledgeable about set-up and use of the following programs: Access, Excel and Power Point - Flexible hours.

<u>Summer Backpack Program</u> – People who like working with children and can give 3-4 hours a week or more throughout the summer helping children in need fill their backpacks with lunches for the week. Will also include registering eligible families, food sorting and inventory.

Grant Writer – Person with experience researching and writing grants. Flexible hours.

<u>Spanish Translator 1</u> – People fluent in Spanish who can regularly work any of the following hours: Tuesday 9-12, Tuesday 1-5 and Saturday 9-12. Duties would be translating for Spanish speaking customers and helping them with their groceries.

Duties include setting up tables and chairs, unloading food from storage and a truck, organizing food on tables for distribution, helping customers, then putting everything away again.
