

TOTAL COMMITMENT - PALM SUNDAY

During the last week of March, we will watch Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem give way to his march of suffering out of Jerusalem to Golgotha. We will listen as the voices that once shout "hosanna" later cry "crucify." In some places worshipers will give voice to both cries through their participation in scripture readings or song.

Such scripting suggests a central truth about the message of Holy Week—that despite all our posturing as Christians and disciples of Christ, we remain deeply ambivalent about this Jesus of Nazareth. In our lives, there are times when we participate in both the crowds that praise Jesus and the crowds that look on him with suspicion and contempt.

Yet, more important than our own fickleness in the story of Jesus' procession, arrest, and death is Christ's unwavering faithfulness toward us. While our conviction changes, Jesus' does not. While our interest fades, Christ's investment in us remains total. His resolved march into Jerusalem continues toward Golgotha even as the crowds disperse and disciples run away. When the cheers of the crowd go silent and then turn sour, Jesus' words of blessing and forgiveness carry on.

The good news today and every day is that God's gracious love is poured out through Christ apart from any accounting of which crowd we stand in or which word is coming from our lips. When we think about it, we really are gathered together not through our commitment to Christ but through Christ's commitment to us. That promise is made to us in baptism, where God marks us forever as God's own. And it is with this promise that we walk through the moments of this week, knowing that in all things Christ has chosen to stand by us.

The WELCA met at 7:00 on Thursday, February 8th, 2018 in the Young Adult Sunday School classroom. We were unable to have our program this month but we held a business meeting. The minutes from the January meeting were reviewed. The Treasurer gave her report. Due to a large donation, our group will be able to contribute to our oxen/plow project when it begins as well as possibly help with some shipping costs for our kits.

Several items were discussed under new business. Wednesday, February 14th will be the

first Lenten Tea for this season. It will be held at Messiah and Barb asked for some donations towards the tea. The Spring Day of Learning will be held on April 21. More information on this event will be forthcoming. We also discussed the WELCA Convention to be held at Camp Mt. Luther on Saturday, July 21, 2018. Further information will come later. One of the offerings for the Convention will be to help raise \$600,000.00 to provide solar power for the Curran Lutheran Hospital in Liberia. Due to the civil wars in Liberia the hospitals were gutted but have been rebuilt. The need for a continuous power source for these hospitals has become a necessity. A movement was started to get solar power to Phoebe Hospital and now the goal is to get it for the Curran Hospital as well. Keep this movement in your prayers. As was shared in our WELCA newsletter, "heart attacks don't wait for the dawn."

DID YOU KNOW ...

- March is the third month of the year, has 31 days, and is named after Mars, the Roman god of war. March is the third month of the year in our modern day Gregorian calendar. It was originally the first month of the year in the Roman calendar and named Martius.
- In the Northern Hemisphere, the meteorological beginning of spring occurs on the first day of March. The March equinox on the 20th or 21st marks the astronomical beginning of spring in the Northern Hemisphere and the beginning of autumn in the Southern Hemisphere, where September is the seasonal equivalent of the Northern Hemisphere's March.
- March's birthstones are aquamarine and bloodstone. These stones symbolize courage. Its birth flower is the daffodil. The zodiac signs for the month of March are Pisces (until March 20) and Aries (March 21 onwards).



- March 2nd is Dr. Seuss's Birthday, more commonly known as Read Across America Day.
- The "Full Worm Moon" will occur on March 1st, while the "Full Blue Moon" will be on March 31st.
- At the time of the "Full Worm Moon," the ground begins to soften enough for earthworm casts to reappear, inviting the return of robins and migrating birds. Roots start to push their way up through the soil, and the Earth experiences a re-birth as it awakens from its winter slumber. In some regions, this is also known as the **Sap Moon**, as it marks the time when maple sap begins to flow and the annual tapping of maple trees begins.
- When two full Moons occur in a single calendar month, the second is called a Blue Moon. In March 2018, a Blue Moon will occur on the 31st.


NITTANY OIL CHURCH PROGRAM

For every gallon of heating oil purchased participating church members from by September 1, 2017 to April 30, 2018, Nittany Energy will donate FOUR CENTS per gallon back to the church's heating oil account at the end of each month. One parishioner purchasing 800 gallons of oil during the heating season will save the church \$32.00 per year on their heating oil. From November to May of last heating season, Messiah's Nittany Energy church program saved the church \$207.53. If you participated last year, then you are already enrolled.
