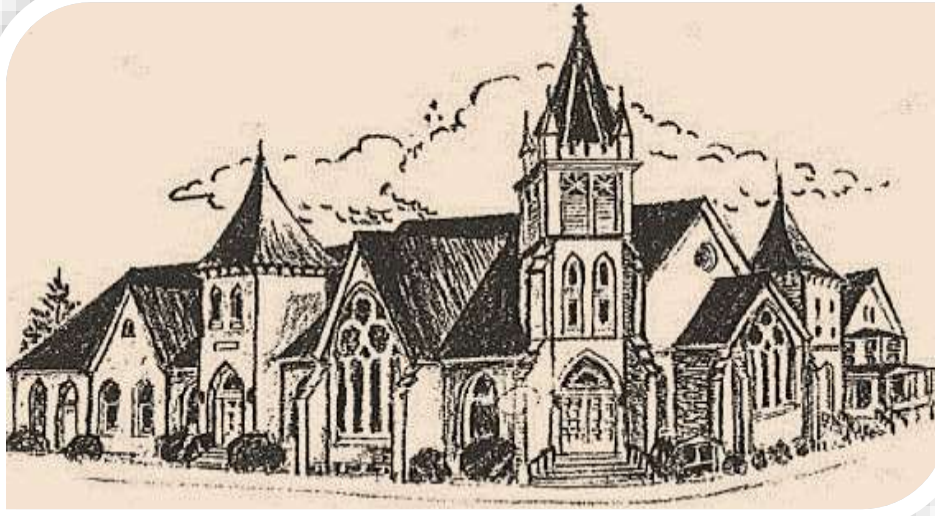

SET FREE!

We live in a time when we can look up facts and search for information with one finger. But finding "the truth"? That is more difficult. In today's gospel Jesus offers us the truth of himself. And as we observe the 501st anniversary of the Reformation, we continue to affirm and live out this truth: we have been saved by grace through faith alone, apart from our works. We have been freed from death's grip on us.

Truth and freedom are two great Reformation themes. It can be tempting to look on the past with a nostalgia that clouds the truth. We may respond to Jesus like the Israelites, denying the ugly parts of our past in the same way they deny their enslavement (John 8:33). However, we too have been set free from the bondage of sin through the love of our Lord Jesus Christ.

If we have been made free, what has God freed us to do, to be? Have we been freed to cling to our past or to live only for ourselves? To be unkind, apathetic, or compassionless? Has God freed us to ignore the poor, the homeless, the immigrant, the refugee, the marginalized?

No. We have been freed from sin so that we might serve and glorify God. We have been freed to live lives that share the good news of Jesus Christ, who became truly human out of love for creation. Beloveds, we have been freed from death so that we can truly live. That is who we are as children of the Reformation; but more important, that is who we are as children of God.

We are free; that's the truth. Now let us live!

DID YOU KNOW??

The **name of the month of October** comes from the Latin “octō”, meaning “eight”, because in the Roman calendar October was the eight month of the year. With the adding of January and February at the beginning of the calendar after the Julian calendar reform, October became the tenth month of the year, as we know it today.

The Anglo-Saxons called October “**Wintirfylith**”, meaning “fullness of winter” because it had the first full moon of the winter season.

Another fun fact about October is that, according to folklore, if the deer have a **gray coat** in this month you should expect a hard winter.

The holiday of **Halloween**, celebrated in October, comes from “All Hallows’ Eve” or the night before “All Hallows” day (“All Saints” day) as in old English “hallow” means “to sanctify”.

The **birthstones** for October are the tourmaline and the opal. Tourmalines display a wide spectrum of colors, such as yellow, pink, blue, red, green, black or brown and they are believed to help you stay calm under pressure, bring peace and tranquility and defeat emotions like anger and jealousy. Opals exhibit different colors (green, white, yellow, blue, pink etc.) depending on the conditions under which they were created. Opal gemstones are believed to cure eye infections, strengthen memory, calm nerves and enhance creativity.

The **traditional flower** of the month of October is the calendula, symbolizing comfort, healing, protection and grace.

Finally, the October full moon is called the Barley Moon, because it is the time to harvest and thresh the ripened barley.

Help students and teachers to enjoy their learning together and enable them to take delight in exploration.

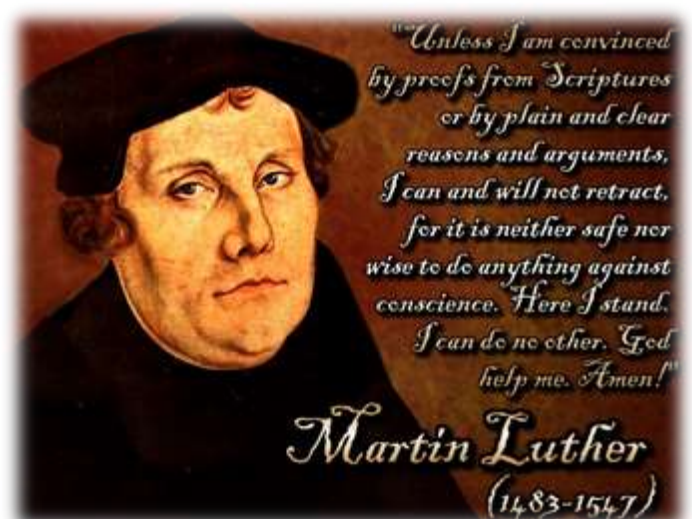
Give them patience in their studies and strength to meet new challenges.

JUNIATA COUNTY FOOD PANTRY OCTOBER UPDATE

Autumn has arrived, soon to be followed by Thanksgiving and Christmas! Again this year the Food Pantry will join forces with the Boy Scouts, Kiwanis, Salvation Army and YOU to bring Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to as many Juniata County families living in poverty as possible. Working as a team and pooling our resources, we can reach more families in need and avoid duplicating services. But we can't do it without your help. When the Boy Scouts come to your door in November for their annual food drive- please give generously. And if you can help us to start stockpiling the following foods for the holidays, we would really appreciate it. Our goal is to provide 800 meals: 400 for Thanksgiving and 400 for Christmas.

In August 2018, the Food Pantry served 308 families in need – a total of 839 individuals. A special thank you to Lost Creek Mennonite Church for providing volunteers for August.
