WORD

Amos was a herdsman by profession and a prophet by God's call. During a time of great prosperity in the northern kingdom of Israel, the prophet speaks to the wealthy upper class. He warns his listeners that fulfilling God's demand for justice brings blessing, while corruption and oppression incur God's wrath.

THE LESSON READS:

⁶Seek the LORD and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it. ⁷Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground!

¹⁰They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth. ¹¹Therefore because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine. ¹²For I know how many are your transgressions, and how great are your sins—you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and push aside the needy in the gate. ¹³Therefore the prudent will keep silent in such a time; for it is an evil time.

On behalf of the whole church, Bishop Collins is deeply gratified by the ministry of these servants of the Gospel.

UPDATE ON THE PASTORAL CALL PROCESS AT MESSIAH CHURCH

A meeting was held at Messiah on Wednesday evening, October 3, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. that included all members of the Call Committee and the Parish Planning Council, Pastor Jim Bricker who is the Dean of the Juniata Valley Conference, and Pastor Craig Miller who is the Assistant to the Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod. The purpose of the meeting was to review the status of the call and share the ministerial needs and visions here at Messiah. One central change is the increase to a full time call from an initial part time call. This is based on the continued support through offerings at Messiah. The discussion included the many ongoing ministries provided by our members at Messiah.

Outcomes from the review included the continued desire to call a pastor for Messuah. The increase to a full time call will enhance this mission. This is a great positive step forward at Messiah.
