

GOD'S DELIGHT - The Ascension of our Lord

Look and see. Open your eyes and know: It is God's joy, God's delight to give life to the dead. This is God's only work under the sun. The Holy One gives life and raises it when it falls.

This theme is everywhere in scripture. It weaves through the law, the prophets, and the psalms. The people of Israel fall into slavery and are set free by the power of God, whose love refuses to let them perish. They are exiles in a foreign land, but the Holy One hears their cries and restores them to their land and life.

The prophet Ezekiel mourns over the house of Israel. They are a valley of dry bones, dead, with no future, until the Spirit of God blows over the bones. Joints are joined, sinews form, and breath returns, restoring the dead to life. Isaiah's suffering servant is crushed, but the Holy One lifts the servant to the fullness of divine favor.

Throughout the psalms, the suffering and oppressed cry for deliverance. But our faithful God in overflowing compassion lifts them from sorrow, again and again, that they might know the life and love of the divine heart.

Were God's joyful intention not clear enough, Jesus comes, blesses, and restores God's broken creation. In the end, his resurrection rips the veil from the mystery of what God has been doing through all of history.

We are witnesses of this as surely as were Jesus' first disciples. We taste and know the power of our death-killing, life-giving God each time our hearts are lifted by the love no death can kill and no tomb can hold.

Jesus raises his hands in blessing as he ascends into the full presence of God. Along with the disciples, we, as witnesses to God's creative and redeeming love, are called to joyfully carry this blessing into the world. Through worship, sharing the holy meal, service, and our many individual gifts, we, too, can help others see God's delightful work.

Barb then read from "40 Days of Reflection-24 Hours That changed the World" written by Adam Hamilton. Adam was the same author of our Lenten Tea Bible Studies that we had this year. The particular chapter that was read was "The Humiliation of the King."

Our Treasurer, Cynthia, gave her report.

The report included in our April Newsletter was approved.

Old Business: Barb thanked Cynthia as well as everyone else who helped with the Lenten Tea. Linda Bahorik was our pianist.

New Business: Barb reported to the group that Camp Mt. Luther is looking for individuals or groups to give \$500.00 to pay for a new camper to come this summer. (Reach 25). Since our church pays for all its campers with the exception of \$50.00 Barb will check with Carolyn as to the status of funds for our campers before we ask for help from the congregation. Our group agreed to donate \$150.00 towards the \$500.00

The WELCA convention will be held at Camp Mt. Luther on July 20th. There are always 2 offerings collected at this time. The Ingathering will go to Lutheran Disaster Relief and the In-Kind Offering will be items for Camp Mt. Luther. We were given a list of 21 items. The group chose 5 and they are: playdoh, markers, duct tape of any color/design, clear scotch tape, and play ground balls of any type. We will have a container in the Adult Sunday School room marked for Camp Mt. Luther and any of the items donated may be put there. Barb will see that they get to the Convention in July.

If anyone is interested in going to the Convention, contact Barb or Linda Leister and we will see that you get a registration form. The cost is \$40.00 which covers lunch, speakers, etc.

Our next project will be the Fabric Kits, which include: 2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric(NO KNITS OR 100% POLYESTER) each piece of fabric is to be 2 1/4 yards of 58"-62" wide fabric or 3 yards of 42"-45" wide fabric, or 4 yards of 34"-37" wide fabric, 2 spools of matching or neutral-colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Our next meeting will be held on Thursday, May 9th with Diana Wise as the program leader.

The meeting closed with our Purpose Statement.

This program provides lunches throughout summer vacation to school students who normally receive free and reduced-price lunches at school. These students often face hunger in the summer months as their families struggle to provide the extra meals. Stuff the Bus will take place at Weis in Mifflintown on Saturday, May 18th from 9-2 and Schlegel's Grocery Store in Thompsontown on Saturday, May 11th from 9-2, or drop off donations for the Backpack Program at the Food Pantry anytime. This year the boys and girls will be traveling with Paul on his dangerous journey to share the truth in Athens, Greece.





An Easter message from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton



Getting a phone call in the middle of the night is never a good thing. I remember the second time my father had open-heart surgery. It was a long procedure and a difficult one, and after it was done the doctor called us to his office and said, "There's been some bleeding. We'll let you know, but you should go home now and rest." And so going home that night, I listened for a phone call in the middle of the night and was awakened only to find out it was morning and it was birds singing, not the phone ringing. My father had made it through the night, and in fact he did recover from the surgery.

This is the joy we feel at Easter, but magnified. All of the hope that had been dashed on Good Friday, the terrible pressure of grief, the terrible pressure of knowing there was no future in the world, only on Sunday to be greeted not by the ringing of a telephone announcing death but the loud clear singing of alleluias. This is the joy we have, and it's a promise so strong that even when we do die, even when we do confront death, we have the hope and the assurance of eternal life.

Easter makes it possible for us, even at the grave, to sing alleluia. Christ is risen. Alleluia. Happy Easter, dear church.
