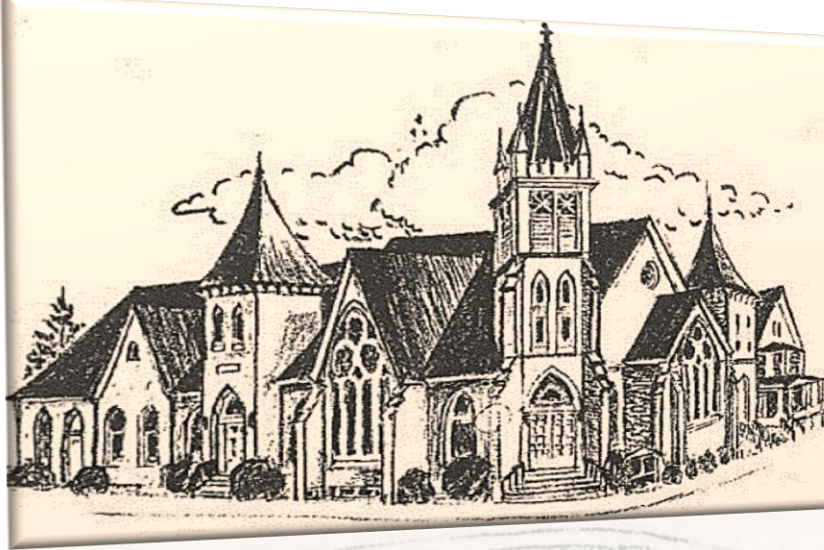

## WHAT IS “GOD’S WORK, OUR HANDS” SUNDAY?

“God’s work. Our hands.” Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) — one church, freed in Christ to love and serve our neighbor. This is our way of life.

The date for 2019 is Sunday, Sept. 8. Mark your congregation’s calendar today! If your congregation cannot participate on Sept. 8, please consider another time that works best.

Whether your congregation lends their hands to stock shelves at the local food pantry, clean community parks and gardens, write thank-you notes to military members and emergency responders or work on advocacy-related projects, your service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: All of life in Jesus Christ — every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life — flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God’s grace.

Since 2013, thousands of ELCA congregations have participated in this dedicated day of service, gathering to serve communities in ways that share the love of God with all of God’s people. The event has quickly become an anticipated way to be “church together” and “church for the sake of the world.”

Whether it’s 30,000 young people doing community volunteer work at the ELCA Youth Gathering, the passionate volunteers of the ELCA homeless ministry network or the devoted members of our congregations who fight for peace and justice in their communities every day, we are a church that boldly does God’s work of restoring and reconciling our communities. This is work you do every day — showing love to your neighbors and helping make your community a better place.

Although the designated day of service is targeted for a Sunday in September, many congregations participate in designated service work several times a year — some even monthly.

## “GOD’S WORK. OUR HANDS.” SUNDAY — WE ARE CHURCH

As Ephesians 2:8-10 reminds us, we are what God has made us — people whom God has created by grace to live in union with Jesus Christ and has prepared to live faithful, fruitful lives by the power of the Holy Spirit. In Jesus Christ, God has reconciled us to God and to each other. As we gather around word and sacraments, this life in Christ is what defines, shapes and guides us as a community of faith, the church. By God’s grace we can and do live confidently and generously in this community of faith and in service of others.

ELCA vital congregations work to strengthen their relationship with God, nurture relationships with each other and create a strong presence with their community. “God’s work. Our hands.” Sunday is one way for congregations to discover ways to build on each of these connections. While service opportunities are endless, ELCA members and congregations are invited to research opportunities for service that make sense for their congregation and its service capacity. The idea is to deepen a congregation’s and the members’ experience in their communities and offer a way for congregations to play a critical part in addressing community needs.

As you begin to explore service opportunities, consider partnering with other congregations in your region or synod. These partnerships may help broaden the scope of your service project and provide ways to nurture synodical connections beyond your congregation.

We are church for the sake of the world, and the ELCA is committed to fostering unity among all God’s children. One way to live out this commitment is to develop ecumenical and inter-religious relationships in your community. “God’s work. Our hands.” Sunday offers a unique opportunity to cultivate these relationships. Inviting other churches and religious

groups to join in the day of service in your community can provide a first step toward discovering more activities to do together throughout the year.

The partnerships you develop with other congregations, your synod and your inter-religious neighbors can deepen your relationship with God, with others in your congregation and with your community.

The service day should not be seen as “replacing worship.” You are encouraged to host your service event after worship, or you and your congregation can arrange for a brief worship service at the site you’re serving and welcome others to worship with you. Consider partnering with other ELCA congregations in your area! The possibilities are endless.

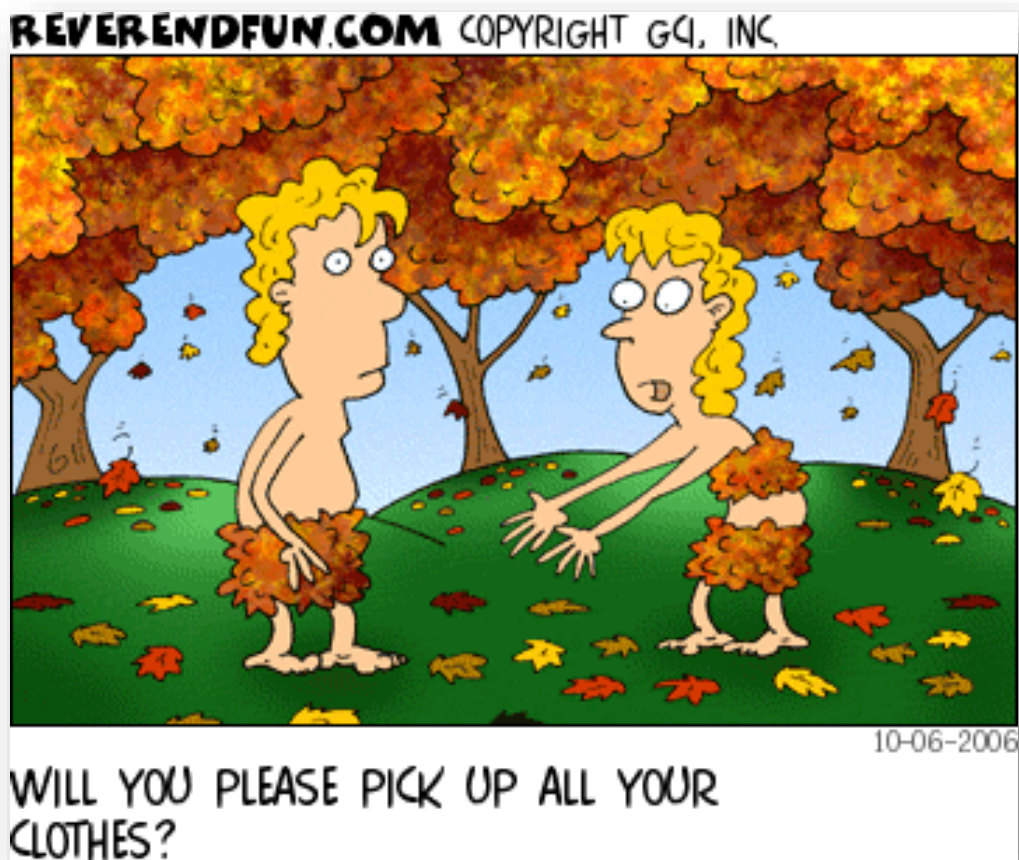

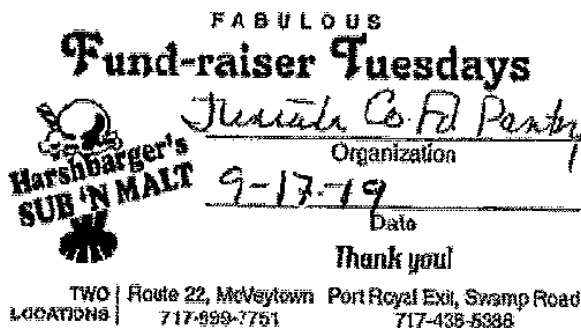
# JUNIATA COUNTY FOOD PANTRY SEPTEMBER UPDATE

- **This annual community worship service occurs thanks to the ongoing support of the Juniata County Agricultural Society and the Juniata County Fair Board of Directors.**

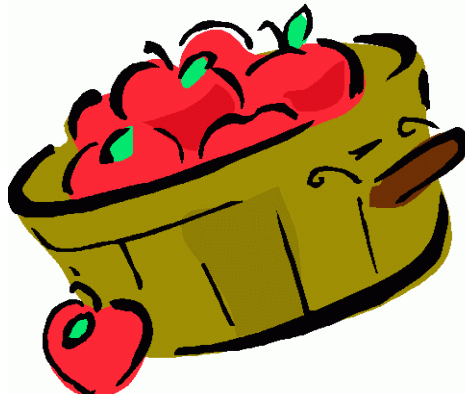
