

AN IMPORTANT LETTER TO OUR CONGREGATION, FRIENDS, AND EXTENDED FAMILIES

Our Messiah Lutheran Church Mission:

To the MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION and FRIENDS,

<u>PART ONE</u>: On behalf of the PPC and the CALL Committee we have some exciting news to share. Our call committee has been diligently working this year and, rather than just waiting for a potential pastoral candidate to be brought to us, they were proactive, and in January raised up a potential candidate's name to the synod. Other persons in our church community also raised up the same name. The result is, we have a pastoral candidate to consider. As most of you know, that name is Messiah's very own Sam Leister.

Consequently, Sam has conferred with Bishop Collins, enrolled in the Gettysburg Seminary, and on August 27, met with and received approval from the Upper Susquehanna Synod candidacy committee. As of this date, Sam is enrolled as a Pastoral candidate and has completed his first course in the TEEM Program (Theology Education for Emerging Ministry). Over the next three years, he must complete fourteen more courses. During this time Sam will have the title of Vicar. In the second and third year of this program Sam must serve an internship under the supervision of a Pastor to be named by the Synod.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, please understand that the final approval for each step of this process rests with you, the congregation. You must first approve his appointment as our Vicar, a Pastor in training. Later you would need to approve his appointment as Intern, and once he is ordained you will vote to extend a "call" for Sam to be our Pastor.

Should you decide to accept Sam as our Vicar, you are asked to support him with your prayers, financially as our full-time supply pastor, and with respect for Sam's changing role within our congregation during this three-year process. Following a congregational vote of acceptance, Sam's starting date as Vicar will be November 1, 2019, when he will begin presiding over all of our services.

As you receive this letter of information, we hope that you give thanks for our good fortune that one of our own has committed to become a Pastor and that he is willing to do it for us, Messiah Lutheran Church.

Please also pray in thanks for our Call Committee. They maintained the highest level of integrity during this process and have given of their time, energy and creative thinking to come to this solution for ministry here at Messiah. We owe them a debt of gratitude so be sure to thank each one of them when you see them. Their work will continue until the Call process is complete.

<u>PART TWO</u>: From Sam Leister, our executive Director, we have the following important announcements for the congregation. We will be holding several important voting meetings during the month of October. These involve two decisions, 1) heating and air conditioning upgrades and 2) ministry at Messiah.

The dates and topics are as follows:

- SUNDAY, OCTOBER 13, 2019 AT 7:00PM IN THE FELLOWSHIP HALL we will meet with Mike Messimer, the HVAC contractor selected by the Property Committee. Mr. Messimer will be available to explain the details of the heating and air conditioning upgrades. Please note that this is both heating and air conditioning. Please note that ALL members at Messiah are encouraged to attend this gathering! The PPC will be present to determine a recommendation regarding the proposal. If the PPC votes to advance the project to the congregation, as required by our by-laws, a special congregational voter's assembly will be held on Sunday, October 27, 2019 immediately following the morning worship service.
- SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2019 IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE, a special congregational voter's assembly will be held for the purpose of voting on the proposal to engage in a covenant relationship with Samuel Leister, who has been entranced in a candidacy process for Word and Sacrament ministry. The process would be as follows: For a period of three years, Sam will complete course and practicum requirements at the United Lutheran Seminary, while at the same time provide pastoral services for Messiah. To start, Sam would conduct weekly worship services, attend council meetings, and provide pastoral care for the sick and shut-in. He would also be allowed to do baptisms and conduct funerals. During this time, Pastor Chris Mathiason would serve as Sam's mentor and begin to step out of the role of Interim for the congregation. When it is time for Sam's Internship years, the last two years of the process, an Internship Supervisor would be appointed by the Bishop to oversee Sam's Internship.
- SUNDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2019 IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE, a special congregational voter's assembly will be held for the purpose of voting on the proposal to upgrade the heating and air conditioning system at Messiah. The need for this voter's assembly will be determined by PPC at the October 13, 2019.

More information will be shared through temple talks before worship services, through a congregational letter, the church newsletter, and the church bulletins. As always, please feel free to contact members of the Parish Planning Council, property committee, and call committee at your convenience.

We must give thanks to our Creator for all that he has provided for us, but we know you have many questions, we all do. Our PPC members, the Call Committee and Bishop Collins will always be available to answer these questions and attend to your concerns as we move through this period of change. With God's help and our prayers, we will cross over both the rough and smooth spots in our path to fulfilling our Messiah Mission as stated in the heading of this letter.

In Jesus' name, I pray, Amen.



ELCA FACTS - DID YOU KNOW??

As of December 31, 2018, there were 3,363,281 baptized members in the ELCA. There were 9,091 congregations organized in 65 synods in nine geographic regions.

The ELCA is a diverse church body, becoming more so every day. This church is committed to growing in diversity and strengthening its global, ecumenical and interfaith relationships around the world.

ELCA congregations are led by gifted men and women who have been called by God to serve their community. The ELCA calls both women and men to serve as pastors and lay rostered leaders. Here are some facts about ELCA leaders:

As of December 31, 2018, there were 17,214 leaders on the ELCA roster including 1,213 Ministers of Word and Service and 16,001 Ministers of Word and Sacrament.
