JOY IN THE HARVEST

Anyone who has ever grown a tomato knows the joy of first fruits. You marvel at the beauty of that first ripe tomato on a vine. You snap a photo for Facebook. You soak in your neighbor's praise at such a successful garden. Then the celebration continues with feast-ing!

Deuteronomy 26 offers a practice of praise for such a momentous time. With some of what they harvest in that first round of gathering, reaping, and gleaning, God's people make their way to one who will join them in giving thanks for the gifts of land and produce. The words they speak tell the story of God's abiding presence with their family. The Israelites speak of Abraham's call and his wandering, the family's slavery in Egypt, the Lord's rescue, and God's gift of a land that provides for its inhabitants abundantly. Reading these instructions, we can almost hear, "Woohoo!" at the conclusion of the speech.

Then joy overflows into a meal for gardener and neighbor alike. After the liturgy of the word comes the meal: "Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house" (Deut. 26:11).

We know the aptness of this practice from our own joy at a single tomato. We know it also from what seems like a universal eagerness of gardeners to share the bounty of harvest ("Could you use some cucumbers? How about green beans?"). Every Sunday we enact a variation on this theme of thanksgiving with a story and a meal. We repeat the story of God's abiding presence with us. We bring our own offerings of thanksgiving. We celebrate by sharing God's gifts given for us and our neighbors alike: bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ. Thanks be to God!

A "New" CHAPTER IN MESSIAH HISTORY

On Sunday, October 20, 2019, the congregation of Messiah Lutheran Church entered a new stage in its history, voting unanimously to a covenant between our church and Sam Leister, a life-long member of Messiah, to become our "pastor in training," or <u>Vicar</u>. We welcome Vicar Leister in this new role and look forward to his leadership with the guidance of our Lord Jesus Christ over the next chapter in our church life.

Below, you can read the covenant between Vicar Leister and Messiah.

TEEM COVENANT

Ministry Site – Messiah Lutheran Church, Mifflintown, PA TEEM Candidate – Samuel Leister

October 20, 2019

The following statements reflect the TEEM Process relationship, during the first year, between the congregation of Messiah Lutheran, Mifflintown and the TEEM Candidate Samuel Leister.

Premise

The TEEM Process is one where a candidate is raised up by the Bishop to prepare for ordained ministry in order to serve a congregation with a specific diversity or ministry situation. The TEEM candidate intentionally serves a congregation while simultaneously completing the educational requirements and candidacy process for ordination to the roster of Word and Sacrament Ministry. The TEEM candidate, upon completion of the educational requirements, receives a TEEM Certificate and through successful examination by the Seminary Faculty and the Synod's Candidacy Committee is approved for ordination to the ministry of Word and Sacrament.

First Steps of this Relationship

Focus: Listening - Observing - Transitioning - Creating a Healthy Learning Environment

Whereas the TEEM candidate is not yet a Pastor, the appropriate title throughout this process is to be <u>Vicar</u>. Vicar Samuel Leister's responsibilities to the congregation in this first year will be as follows:

- Vicar Leister will lead weekly worship services, as well as any other special or mid-week worship services of the congregation. He will be allowed to preside at the Eucharist, due to the fact that he is being placed into the congregation for the purpose of providing continuous worship leadership.
- Vicar Leister will be present for all council meetings, involved with worship planning and Christian Education for the congregation. He will be involved in these areas of ministry, but

not responsible for taking on the leadership in any of these areas. Because of this, he will need to step down as the current council president.

- Vicar Leister, with mentor supervision, will be allowed to officiate at baptisms and funerals for the members of this congregation. Any requests for baptisms or funerals outside of the membership of this congregation will not be permitted. Due to Pennsylvania State Law, he will not be permitted to officiate weddings until he has been ordained.
- Vicar Leister will provide pastoral care for members of this congregation when there are emergencies, hospital stays, or illnesses. He will also help in the visitation of members who are homebound or in long-term nursing facilities.
- Vicar Leister will stay in communication with the Bishop to offer updates, joys, concerns, or needs that may surface during the TEEM Process.

The responsibilities of the congregation to Vicar Leister and the TEEM Process will be as follows:

- The council of Messiah, Mifflintown will establish a three-person team who will serve as the "Mutual Ministry" team for the TEEM candidate and TEEM Process. One of these three shall be a current member of the council. These three shall have the characteristics of being good listeners/observers, those whom other members of the congregation will trust and be willing to talk to, and fair truth tellers meaning, they won't hesitate at speaking the truth to the candidate or to the congregation in order to promote a healthy learning environment.
- Members of the congregation will respect the TEEM Process and not expect Vicar Leister to take charge or do anything beyond his listed responsibilities. This means an adjustment to relationships in order to view Vicar Leister as a Candidate for Ordained Ministry who now serves the congregation in a different role. If other needs do arise, then the Vicar or council president will contact the Bishop to discuss additions to his responsibilities.
- Members of the congregation will be open to share joys and concerns with the Mutual Ministry team, established for this process, to help promote a healthy learning environment.
- The council president will stay in communication with the Bishop to offer updates, joys, concerns, or needs that may surface during the TEEM Process.
- The following compensation guidelines will be followed for this first year:
 \$125.00 per worship service, \$150 for two worship services on the same day
 \$20.00 per hour of time spent in meetings and visitation
 IRS mileage compensation for travel related to visitation or off-site meetings, such as conference meetings or required synod events

Continuing Education allowance in the amount of \$500 / \$700 to help cover Seminary books, housing and travel expenses

4 vacation Sundays and 2 weeks of vacation time, without compensation *Paychecks will be given on the 15th and 30th of each month*

Or...

Paychecks will be given every two weeks
