When he orders that evil people be put to death, it will take place. ⁵He will put godliness on as if it were his belt. He'll wear faithfulness around his waist. ⁶Wolves will live with lambs. Leopards will lie down with goats. Calves and lions will eat together. And little children will lead them around. ⁷Cows will eat with bears. Their little ones will lie down together. And little children will ke oxen. ⁸A baby will play near a hole where cobras live. In the same way, the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the Lord. ¹⁰At that time the man who is called the Root from Jesse's family line will be like a banner that brings nations together. They will come to him. And the place where he rules will be glorious.
