VICAR'S MARCH MESSAGE

Dear Messiah Family,

We are now into the Season of Lent. The Latin word, Quadragesima, meaning fortieth, expresses the forty days of this time of preparation for the Passion and Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends approximately six weeks (40 days) later on Holy Thursday, the memorial of the Lord's Supper, the Thursday of Holy Week before Easter Sunday. As Lutherans, we end Lent with the evening of Holy Saturday, the night before Easter. This calculation makes Lent last 46 days if the 6 Sundays are included, but only 40 days if they are excluded.

In Lent, many Christians commit to fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries in order to replicate the account of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. The three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigor during Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Prayer is our communication with God. Let us open this path and allow for a two-way street with Jesus in our lives. Fasting is the refraining not only of foods but of festivals and pleasures throughout this solemn time of our church year. Almsgiving must be remembered as more than just sharing one's wealth and money. We must give ourselves through caring and nurturing our neighbors. All these things are reinvigorated during Lent and carried forward by our hands and in our hearts throughout the year.

The Bible Study for the Lenten Teas this year asks us among other things to give up <u>bitterness</u>, grudges, grievances, smoldering hatred, broken relationships; to give up <u>apathy</u>, quitting on life, not caring, not trying; and to give up <u>discouragement</u>, feeling sorry for ourselves when we have experienced difficult times. Eat all the chocolate you want, but fast from bitterness by repairing grudges and broken relationships. Eat all the gourmet meals you desire, but fast from apathy by feasting on commitment and energizing love of our neighbors. Eat all the spicy, tasty food you crave, but fast on discouragement by indulging in the awareness of the peace which Jesus gives and understanding that through His love we are strengthened ourselves and are sent to strengthen our neighbors in their trials and tribulations.

Pope Francis put into words more ways to fast during Lent. Fast from hurting words and say kind words. Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worries and have trust in God. Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressure and be prayerful. Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

This Lent, intensify your prayer as uprightness toward God, choose your fasting as honesty toward self, and grow your almsgiving as love toward neighbors.


