

## **A LOOK INTO LUTHER'S SMALL CATECHISM**

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Father, Jesus Christ, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

Let us all pray for an outstanding October! The church seasons are changing with the calendar seasons. We complete the church year with Christ the King Sunday on November 22 this year. As we continue with the Time after Pentecost, we celebrate Reformation Sunday on October 25 and All Saints Day on November 1. Let us all pray to follow the will of God our Father and to care for His creation in all our times and in all our places.

Once again, take a moment to refer to the Ten Commandments to Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5. If you do not have a copy of Luther's Small Catechism, please contact the church office; the cost for a paper copy is minimal. You can also find Luther's Small Catechism online by searching for this. The pre sermon review finishes the Ten Commandments in October. With each commandment, Luther asks, "What is this? or What does this mean?" Luther then explains what we are not to do. With the tenth commandment, we are not to entice, force, or steal away from our neighbor their spouse, household workers, or livestock." What we are to do is "instead to stay and fulfill their responsibilities to our neighbors."

Take some time to study the Ten Commandments in the light of what Jesus says in Matthew 22, where we read these verses. <sup>37</sup>He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' <sup>38</sup>This is the greatest and first commandment. <sup>39</sup>And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>40</sup>On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." Then read once more how Martin Luther shares the "do" statements for each commandment. You can see why Jesus desires our unconditional love of God and our unconditional love of our neighbors. What ways of love are you finding in your lives that meet the needs of your neighbors?

As a final lead-in for October study of Luther's Small Catechism, we will be looking at the articles of the Apostle's Creed. We confess each Sunday in this belief, and let us examine what we say, so we know this in our hearts and souls. Your homework this is to study these words and search their meaning. If this study of the Commandments and Creed reminds you of your days in Catechism class, wonderful. If this study of the Commandments and Creed seems new to you, then this is even better. The study of God's Word is a wonderful part of our lives in Christ.

May the Lord be with you all!

## JUNIATA COUNTY FOOD PANTRY OCTOBER UPDATE

Autumn has arrived! Soon to be followed by Thanksgiving and Christmas. Again this year the Food Pantry will join forces with the Boy Scouts, Kiwanis, and <u>YOU</u> to bring Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to as many Juniata County families living in poverty as possible. Working as a team and pooling our resources, we can reach more families in need and avoid duplicating services. But we can't do it without <u>your</u> help. When the Boy Scouts come to your door in November for their annual food drive-please give generously. And if you can help us to start stockpiling the following foods for the holidays, we would really appreciate it. Our goal is to provide 800 meals: 400 for Thanksgiving and 400 for Christmas.

In August 2020, the Food Pantry served 207 families in need – a total of 563 individuals. A special thank you to Lost Creek Mennonite Church and Lauvers Mennonite Church for providing volunteers for August.

# MESSIAH'S NEW "MISSION OF THE MONTH" INITIATIVE

At the Parish Planning Council meeting on Sunday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, our members chose unanimously to seek donations for the fire victims on the west coast of the United States. The monies will be sent from Messiah directly to the Lutheran Disaster Response. 100% of the donations are provided directly to the those devastated by the record-setting fires. Additionally, the PPC allocated funds to match congregational donations up to \$1,000.00. This money comes from budgeted funds that have been unused this calendar year due to the shutdown from the Covid-19 Pandemic. This is just one way in which we can extend our mission in Christ's love beyond the walls of our church building.

## FULL COMMUNION PARTNERS -- DID YOU KNOW?

**FULL COMMUNION PARTNERSHIP** is when two denominations develop a relationship based on a common confessing of the Christian faith and a mutual recognition of Baptism and sharing of the Lord's Supper. This does not mean the two denominations merge; rather, in reaching agreements, denominations also respect differences. These denominations worship together, may exchange clergy, and also share a commitment to evangelism, witness and service in the world. Each entity agrees that even with differences, there is nothing that is church-dividing.

A central document to Lutherans is the *Augsburg Confession*. Article VII of the *Augsburg Confession* states that "the true unity of the church" is present where the gospel is rightly preached, and sacraments rightly administered. The ELCA is committed to this model of full communion as an authentic expression of Christian unity.
