

The Lord is near. ⁶Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁶And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. ⁶Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. ⁶Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. ⁸Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' ¹⁰Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, ¹²and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' And he was speechless. ¹³Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' ¹⁴For many are called, but few are chosen."

MESSIAH'S NEW "MISSION OF THE MONTH" INITIATIVE – At the Parish Planning Council meeting on Sunday, September 27th, our members chose unanimously to seek donations for the fire victims on the west coast of the United States. The monies will be sent from Messiah directly to the Lutheran Disaster Response. One hundred percent of the donations are provided directly to those devastated by the record-setting fires. Additionally, the PPC allocated funds to match congregational donations up to \$1,000.00. This money comes from budgeted funds that have been unused this calendar year due to the shutdown from the Covid-19 Pandemic.
