



Zephaniah (like the prophet Amos in last week's first reading) presents the day of the Lord as one of judgment and wrath. Descriptions of the last day in the New Testament include details taken from Old Testament accounts of the day of the Lord.

¹⁰The span of our life is seventy years, perhaps in strength even eighty; yet the sum of them is but labor and sorrow, for they pass away quickly and we are gone.

¹¹Who regards the power of your wrath? Who rightly fears your indignation?]


¹²So teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts to wisdom.

You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? ²⁷Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. ²⁹For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. ³⁰As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

THIS MONTH'S "MISSION OF THE MONTH" at Messiah will be for our local Juniata County Food Pantry. The monies will be sent from Messiah directly to the Food Pantry. In addition to your generosity, the PPC allocated funds to match congregational donations up to \$1,000.00. This money comes from budgeted funds that have been unused this calendar year due to the shutdown from the Covid-19 Pandemic. This is just one way in which we can extend our mission in Christ's love beyond the walls of our church building.

DECORATING OF THE CHURCH will take place the week of Sunday, November 29th in order to keep decorators social distanced. If any family would like to volunteer to help decorate an area of the church and have not yet been contacted, please contact Tawny Mummah. In addition, our annual Hanging of the Greens service which would normally be held on December 6th (the second Sunday of Advent) is on hold to be announced at this time due to social distancing requirements and the number of people we usually use for this service.

TENTATIVE INFORMATION FOR CHRISTMAS EVE – This year, it was decided that we would tentatively offer two services – one beginning at 7:00 p.m. and the other at 9:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve. The 7:00 p.m. service would be geared a bit more towards younger children, while the 9:00 p.m. service will be for older children, families, and others who choose to attend. Both services will be broadcast on Facebook Live as well as on AM 1700. Masks will still be required as well as social distancing rules. Communion will only be offered during the 9:00 p.m. service and each service will last no longer than 45 minutes. There will be NO candlelighting this year; however, congregants will be asked to shine their lights on their phones during the time we normally light the individual candles. If Covid shuts things down in our area around this time, we will turn to a complete, single, remote service at 7:00 p.m. which will be broadcast on Facebook Live and AM 1700....plus we will try to send out a Zoom link to everyone.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION will be offered following the sending hymn in order to minimize any contact during the meal. We will be using communion kits that are pre-packaged and sealed that include a wafer and grape juice. Each person desiring to share in the meal will take a packaged kit when you receive a bulletin.
