THE VICAR'S MESSAGE

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Father, Jesus Christ, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

This month I share a few more thoughts from another one of my seminary classes from the last full week of June. What thought first enters your mind when you hear "Christian Education?" We have a board of Christian Education as part of our Parish Planning Council on which Linda Clark is doing wonderful ministry for our congregation.

I ask you now to form in your mind the image of Christian Education as Faith Formation. Faith formation is caught by Christians rather than taught to each other. Forming your faith is a never-ending process and shared with each other and for each other. Think now of the many ways you can form your faith and help others to catch faith through Jesus Christ.

A foundation of faith formation has roots in the family. Read and share scriptures together. Pray together at mealtimes, at bedtimes, in the morning, in the evening, and any time. Encourage individual prayers; these are conversations with God. Study the scripture and share caring conversations regarding faith. Invite others to events in and around the church. If nothing is happening, start something. Be genuine and encourage others with love and care as Jesus taught us and the Holy Spirit guides us.

Continue now to read through the Gospel of Mark in August for Messiah's Book of the Month Club. August's goal is to read chapters 13 through 16. Remember as you read these next four chapters of Mark; feel free to read them aloud to others. Who do you say that Jesus is? As the summer heats up, we are reminded that hunger does NOT take a vacation! Please don't forget your neighbors struggling to keep their families fed while everyone else enjoys summer vacation. Thanks to all of you who are bringing in fresh produce from your gardens! What a blessing straight from the Lord is fresh produce to those who rarely taste any but the canned variety, and very little of that.

In June 2021, the Food Pantry served 165 families in need – a total of 373 individuals. In addition, our Summer Backpack Program provided over 1,100 lunches for 55 school age children who otherwise would be facing a hungry summer vacation. 
