## THE VOICE OF THE VICAR

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

Look at the Ten Commandments found in Exodus 20, read the first commandment located in verse 3. Luther's Small Catechism includes an explanation of this commandment. "What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things." A question discussed in the confirmation class was, "How can we 'love' and 'fear' God at the same time?" How can we both love and fear anyone or anything at the same time? Take time during the next month to ask this of Messiah's confirmands. As a thought, look up the meaning of "revere" as this word might be used in place of "fear" in the explanation of the commandments.

Luther's Small Catechism can be found online in PDF form. If you would like a copy, we can share one with you or we can order a copy for you to study. When you see any of our confirmands, please feel free to ask them about their studies.

Regarding the "Book of the Month" studies, we are continuing to read one psalm each day. On November first, Psalm 62 is the reading for that day. Simply add 61 and use a calendar to mark off the psalms you read. If you miss one, just make it up sometime.

The book of Psalms contains many prayers. As you read Psalm 31, read it as a prayer. You will find elements of praise and thanksgiving as well as supplications to God. These are as truthful and valid today for us as in the days they were first spoken and written. As you read through these lovely prayers, poems, and songs, make a list of ones that stand out in your mind and soul; maybe circle the number on the calendar or on your list.

Take a close look at Psalm 62. Verses 1-2 are "For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. <sup>2</sup>He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken." How does this tie in with the First Commandment? Can you hear the psalmist singing these verses while you hear God speak the Commandment?

As we follow the church calendar through November, we will celebrate All Saints Day when we remember the Saints Triumphant, those who passed from an earthy life to a life in God's Kingdom. Then, come and share the Thankoffering service on November 14. The final Sunday of our church year is Christ the King Sunday celebrated this year on November 21. Finally, the church new year begins with the First Sunday in Advent, November 28.

Let us continue to serve others in need during these extreme times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. Remain steadfast in your faith in the Love of Jesus to bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you. Find ways to carry God's Love to others whom we must for now remain physically at a distance but can and must embrace with our spiritual arms and our souls.

May the Lord be with you all!


