THE VOICE OF THE VICAR

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

Happy New Year!!! The church New Year began with the First Sunday in Advent, November 28. This leads us through one of the busiest months of the church year and one of the most exciting. The four candles of the Advent wreath each symbolize a special gift of God. They are hope, love, joy, and peace. Each week another candle is lit on the wreath.

Advent is a time of preparation and in our case, we are preparing to celebrate the coming birth of the Son of God, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Advent is an exciting time for all of us. Decorations go up inside and outside the building that include wreaths, crèche displays, candles, trees, and banners. The Sunday morning worship services grow and evolve as we approach the Nativity of our Lord. Hymns emphasize a sense of watchfulness for God to be with us.

One hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" is sung during Advent and when we bring forward a wooden crèche figure to the front of the nave. Emmanuel is from a Hebrew word meaning "God is with us." The first candle of Advent, "Hope" shines through in this hymn. Love, Joy, and Peace glow in the realization that "*God IS with us*" now and to the end of time.

Regarding the "Book of the Month" studies, we are continuing to read one psalm each day. On December first, Psalm 92 is the reading for that day. Simply add 91 and use a calendar to mark off the psalms you are reading.

Whether you count chapters or verses, through December you are reading through center of the Bible. Different sources based on various counting rubrics list the middle as Psalm 103, Psalm 117, or Psalm 118. One source shares that Psalm 117, the shortest chapter, is the 595th Chapter. Reading Psalm 117, who should praise the Lord and are we a chosen people? According to a "middle verse" in Psalm 118:8, is it better to trust others or to trust God?

Let us continue to serve others in need during these extreme times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. Remain steadfast in your faith in the Love of Jesus to bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you. Find ways to carry God's Love to others whom we must for now remain physically at a distance but can and must embrace with our spiritual arms and our souls.

May the Lord be with you all!

ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY

On Sunday, November 7th, we observed All Saints' Sunday, a day where we remembered, with thanksgiving, all of the people of God, living and dead, who form the mystical body of Christ.
