## THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Messiah Family,

During Lent our studies and Gospel messages move from those of the Sermon on the Mount to chapters from the Gospel of John. As we examine these scriptures, take a moment to read them. These will form the basis of the Sunday sermons through March.

For the first Sunday in March, we study John, chapter 3, verses 1 through 17. Contained within these verses is the ever-constant John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." This text tells us that it was with God that the gift of salvation started. It was God who sent his Son because He loved all the world, not a nation; not the good people; not only the people who loved him; it was the world. The unlovable and the unlovely, the lonely who have no one else to love them, the person who loves God and the person who never thinks of God, the individual who rests in the love of God and the one who spurns it--all are included in this vast inclusive love of God.

On March 12, the Gospel is from John chapter 4, verses 5 through 42. As you read these verses, put yourself in the position of an observer at the well. This is quite a long conversation, and you might well ask, "Why is Jesus taking all this time to teach a Samaritan woman?" His words are not spoken in judgment and condemnation. His gift of salvation and eternal life transcends the actions of her past. His gift of salvation and eternal life transcends nations, people, and cultures.

For March 19, the fourth Sunday of Lent, the Gospel is from John chapter 9, verses 1 through 41. As you read this scripture, seek the reactions of the neighbors and the Pharisees. Why would these folks question the healing and doubt the presence of God in this action? How would you describe the healed blind-man's reaction by the third interrogation by the Pharisees? What are your thoughts on verse 39?

And on Sunday, March 26, the Gospel is from John chapter 11 verses 1 through 45. Lazarus is raised from the dead. In these verses Jesus weeps. Also, within this scripture are the words of Jesus, "Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!






