#### THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Father, Jesus Christ, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

We have a busy month in our church year coming in March. Wednesday evening Lent services are held at 7:00 pm rotating between St. Stephen's, Aldersgate and Messiah. Pastors Mindy Petrovcic, Richard Adams, and I are providing the messages which center on the wounds which Jesus Christ endured through the crucifixion. The sermon topics are "Scourging" on February 28, "Crown of Thorns on March 6, "Hands" on March 13, "Feet" on March 20, and "Side" on March 27. Check the schedule in this newsletter and the Sunday bulletins for more details.

We celebrate Palm Sunday on March 24. With his triumphant entrance into Jerusalem Jesus follows the path to the Cross and to our salvation through God's grace and the forgiveness of all our sins. We are preparing for the sharing of the Passion of Christ according to Mark during the worship service. We will once more hold a Maundy Thursday breakfast at 7 am on March 28 in the Fellowship Hall. This is followed by the stripping of the Altar showing the emptiness of Good Friday. Let us rejoice with the somberness of Lent, the excitement of Palm Sunday, and the total abandonment of Holy Week as we approach the joys and celebrations of the resurrection on Easter Sunday on March 31.

For the month of March to read the four chapters of the Book of Ruth. Think about these questions: What do you think Ruth must have felt through her experiences and the experiences of her mother-in-law and sister-in-law? If you were teaching a Sunday school class of children about Ruth, what would you tell them about her? If you were teaching a Sunday school class of adults, what would you include in your lessons about Ruth? Now, take some time and "practice" sharing the Book of Ruth with others. If you have children in your group, talk with them about Ruth.

Let us continue to serve others in need during these extreme times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. Remain steadfast in your faith in the Love of Jesus to bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you. Find ways to carry God's Love to others and embrace them with our spiritual arms and souls.

May the Lord be with you all!

All non-perishable foods especially canned beets and cereal; Toilet paper, paper products and cleaning supplies.




