### \* SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

P In Holy Baptism our gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

### Parents: We present Lando Albie Kerlin to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

P Lando Albie Kerlin, do you desire to be baptized?

### Parents: I do.

P In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring him to the services of God's house, and teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As he grows in years, you should place in his hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for his instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of his Baptism and in communion with the Church, he may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.

Do you promise to fulfill these obligations?

### Parents: Yes, by the help of God.

P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things.

By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that he who is here baptized may be given new life. Wash away the sin of this child who is cleansed by this water and bring him forth as an inheritor of your glorious kingdom.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?

### Parents: Yes, by the help of God.

- C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
- C I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the

### forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

P Lando Albie Kerlin, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The Lord be with you.

### C And also with you.

P God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Pour your Holy Spirit upon Lando, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence.

NEW!! – MASKING UPDATE FOR MESSIAH – After nearly 17 months of masking, social distancing, deep cleaning, keeping aware of those around us, getting vaccinated, and staying at home as much as possible, restrictions are starting to be lifted in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. As of June 28<sup>th</sup>, Governor Wolf and Pennsylvania's state legislature has agreed that the masking mandate that has been in effect for our state since March of 2020 will be a thing of the past, hopefully for a long time to come. But even with the order lifted, and all restrictions lifted earlier in the month, the Department of Health says people will still have to follow CDC guidance for wearing masks, like wearing one when a business requires it or wearing one on public transportation.

With all of this in mind, beginning on <u>Sunday, July 4<sup>th</sup></u>, Messiah will begin to follow these lifted restrictions. Both masking and social distancing will be **OPTIONAL** unless restrictions are re-issued. Hower, we will continue to print the hymns in the bulletins as well as continue with our current communion cup combo (wafer/juice) until September 5<sup>th</sup>, when we return to 10:30 a.m. services. At this point, we hope to have all hymnals back in place as well as the use of the wafer and wine, as well as manna bread, ready for full communion once again. Also in September, we will continue with senior choir rehearsals (get your singing voices ready!!) as well as Junior Church and Sunday School! So plan on slowly getting back to "normal"....and we thank God for guiding us through these past 17 months (not 17 years like the cicadas!).

JULY'S "MISSION OF THE MONTH" at Messiah will be for Lutheran Disaster Relief. The monies will be sent from Messiah directly to Lutheran Disaster Relief by way of the Upper Susquehanna Synod. These funds will help those across the United States, from the building collapse in Miami Beach to flooding and tornado victims among many others. In addition to your generosity, the PPC allocated funds to match congregational donations up to \$1,000.00. This is just one way in which we can continue to extend our mission in Christ's love beyond the walls of our church building.

WORSHIP VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! A bequest of money has been made to Messiah in memory of Mary Ernest, who passed away last year. Mary (and Max) were avid supporters and leaders of Messiah's youth program for many years "back in the day" and now, with Mary's passing, the family is paying it forward in hopes that the technology purchased can be used by the youth, young adults, and young-at-heart to enhance not only our worship services, but also Sunday School, Bible School, and other programs taking place at Messiah.

However, even with the purchase of this equipment, which includes iPads, an Apple TV and projector, we need volunteers to learn how to operate the equipment. (You will **NOT** have to maintain the equipment if you are apprehensive about such things). So, before purchasing this equipment, if anyone would like to step up and volunteer to learn how to click a few buttons on Sunday morning or project things through the projector via the Apple TV, please contact Bob St. Clair or Vicar Leister as soon as possible. Once we have volunteers lined up, then we can plan on making the final purchase of products and implement this equipment starting with our September 5<sup>th</sup> service, when we go back to 10:30 a.m. services. Also, because you volunteer does not mean you are stuck working with this every program.....we will figure things out and availability of people as we go.
