We continue celebrate during May the season of Easter. Each Sunday listen and hear a new message about the grace of God and the resurrection of Jesus Christ that frees us from the burdens of sin and death. On Thursday May 26, we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. Take a moment and read Luke 24:44-53 one more time. Note there is more to the Ascension than Jesus simply being lifted into Heaven. Look at verse 47 and imagine Jesus saying this not to his disciples, but directly to you. How does that image make you feel?

## ANNOUNCEMENT FOR IMPORTANT SPRING \& SUMMER EVENT DATES

It is with profound thanksgiving and immense joy that the Parish Planning Council of Messiah Lutheran Church announces to all church members and all members of our Christian community the following special dates for 2022:

1) Sunday, March 20, the Parish Planning Council of Messiah received a recommendation from its Call Committee to extend a Call for Pastoral Duties to Vicar Samuel Leister. The PPC voted unanimously to recommend Vicar Leister to the congregation's Voters' Assembly for a Vote to Call upon his acceptance by the Upper Susquehanna Valley Synod of the ELCA as a Pastoral Candidate.
2) On April 21, the Upper Susquehanna Valley Synod of the ELCA conducted a Pastoral Candidacy Interview with Vicar Samuel Leister at which he was accepted as a Pastoral Candidate. We here at Messiah are now free to extend a Pastoral Call to Vicar Leister and to conduct a Vote to Call at a Voters' Assembly meeting.
3) On May 1, the first official announcement for a VOTE-TO-CALL SCHEDULED FOR MAY 15, 2022, will be conducted at the regular Sunday worship service.
4) On May 8, the second official announcement for a VOTE-TO-CALL SCHEDULED FOR MAY 15, 2022, will be conducted at the regular Sunday worship service.
5) ON MAY 15, 2022, A VOTE-TO-CALLVicar Samuel Leister to fulfill the pastoral duties at Messiah Lutheran Church will be conducted by a Representative of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the ELCA. The vote will be conducted at a Voters' Assembly meeting held at the conclusion of the regular Sunday service where a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote by those members present is required to approve the Call. Please mark your calendar, pray for our congregation, pray for Vicar Leister, attend and vote.
6) Anticipating a favorable Vote-to-Call, the Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod will conduct the PASTORAL ORDINATION SERVICE FOR VICAR LEISTER ON JULY 3, 2022, AT 3:00 PM in the Messiah Lutheran Church sanctuary. All Messiah Lutheran Church members and Christian Believers are invited to attend this very special and historic ceremony.
7) Immediately following the Ordination Service, the Synod Bishop will conduct the INSTALLATION SERVICE FOR PASTOR SAMUEL LEISTER as the Pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church.
8) ON JULY 3 AT APPROXIMATELY 4:30 PM AN ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION RECEPTION AND CELEBRATION DINNER will be held in the Messiah Lutheran Church Fellowship Hall for all members and friends of Messiah Lutheran Church.

## I know that my Redeemer lives

This Easter, many of us will be able to gather in person for glorious celebrations of our Lord's resurrection. But the first Easter was in a cemetery, surrounded by tombstones. The women and then the men disciples came to see what had happened to their Lord. They expected to find a dead body, but instead they found God's defiant answer to death.

As St. Paul writes in Corinthians, "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Oh, death, where is your victory? Oh, death, where is your sting?"

I know now that we're entering the third year of this pandemic, and we see the signs of stress and incivility, even the signs of war and disease in Ethiopia and Sudan, in Europe. It might seem like death still has sway, but we can declare confidently on this Easter and all times what Job said, "I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then in my flesh, I shall see God."

Centuries ago, the Russian Orthodox developed this beautiful poem, the Kontakion of the Departed. It's often used at gravesites. "Give rest, O Christ, to your servants with your saints, where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting. You only are immortal, the creator and maker of humankind, and we are mortal, formed of the earth and to the earth shall we return. For so you did ordain when you created a thing. You are dust and to dust you shall return. All of us go down to the dust. Yet even at the grave we make our song. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia."
