

VOICE OF THE VICAR

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

Many of us make New Year's resolutions. Some resolutions are kept but most eventually fall by the wayside and are forgotten. Let us resolve to follow a path this summer of reconnecting with others as we move forward from the times of isolation and reduced personal contact with others in our congregation and community. In this newsletter and in the weekly Sunday bulletins you will find lists of shut-ins and those in need of prayers. The act of lifting up in prayers others and their needs is a wonderful way to put into practice our faith in Christ through the Holy Spirit. Pray often.

The next step on this journey through faith formation is to make a greeting card, a "thinking of your" card, a note of any kind. Now, do NOT mail it! Save a stamp and take the card to folks on that shut-in list and prayer list. Take a few minutes to say a prayer with them, to read from the Bible, to say, "Hello, I am thinking of you." Most of all, take a few moments to listen to them and to their stories. Remember that as you give, you also receive. Share the peace of Jesus.

For a new "Book of the Month" study, during June, looking through the Book of Acts, read closely the chapters 7 through 10. In these chapters you will find murder and rebirth, faith beyond life itself in this world, and faith in Christ that is shared with all people regardless of religious background and upbringing. The last half of Chapter 10 may sound like a review of what transpired in the earliest days of the church but read through these verses again and listen for a description of a path which we must take. How does faith direct you to share the Good News and bring a nurturing, growing faith to others?

Let us continue to serve others in need during these extreme times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. Remain steadfast in your faith in the Love of Jesus to bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you. Find ways to carry God's Love to others whom we must for now remain physically at a distance but can and must embrace with our spiritual arms and our souls.

ANNOUNCEMENT FOR IMPORTANT UPCOMING EVENTS

It is with profound thanksgiving and immense joy that the Parish Planning Council of Messiah Lutheran Church announces to all church members and all members of our Christian community the following special dates for 2022:

- 1) Sunday, March 20, the Parish Planning Council of Messiah received a recommendation from its Call Committee to extend a Call for Pastoral Duties to Vicar Samuel Leister. The PPC voted unanimously to recommend Vicar Leister to the congregation's Voters' Assembly for a Vote to Call upon his acceptance by the Upper Susquehanna Valley Synod of the ELCA as a Pastoral Candidate.
- 2) On April 21, the Upper Susquehanna Valley Synod of the ELCA conducted a Pastoral Candidacy Interview with Vicar Samuel Leister at which he was accepted as a Pastoral Candidate. We here at Messiah were then free to extend a Pastoral Call to Vicar Leister and to conduct a Vote to Call at a Voters' Assembly meeting.
- 3) On May 1, the first official announcement for a **VOTE-TO-CALL SCHEDULED FOR MAY 15, 2022**, was conducted at the regular Sunday worship service.
- 4) On May 8, the second official announcement for a **VOTE-TO-CALL SCHEDULED FOR MAY 15, 2022**, was conducted at the regular Sunday worship service.
- 5) ON MAY 15, 2022, A VOTE-TO-CALL Vicar Samuel Leister to fulfill the pastoral duties at Messiah Lutheran Church was conducted by a Representative of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the ELCA. The vote was conducted at a Voters' Assembly meeting held at the conclusion of the regular Sunday service where a two-thirds (2/3) majority voted by those members present required to approve the Call.
- 6) The Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod will conduct the <u>PASTORAL</u> <u>ORDINATION SERVICE FOR VICAR LEISTER ON JULY 3, 2022, AT 3:00 PM</u> in the Messiah Lutheran Church sanctuary. All Messiah Lutheran Church members and Christian Believers are invited to attend this very special and historic ceremony.
- 7) Immediately following the Ordination Service, the Synod Bishop will conduct the *INSTALLATION SERVICE FOR REVEREND SAMUEL LEISTER* as the Pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church.
- 8) ON JULY 3, 2022, AT APPROXIMATELY 4:30 PM AN ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION RECEPTION AND CELEBRATION DINNER will be held in the Messiah Lutheran Church Fellowship Hall for all members and friends of Messiah Lutheran Church.




