THE PASTORS PONDERINGS

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

My intention in the months to come is to share some insights and thoughts regarding scriptures and the study thereof. Over the years at Messiah, I have seen a number of Bible translations and have been blessed to explore a few of them. The scripture readings and Gospel message each Sunday are from the New Revised Standard Version which is used by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. Below are several translations of Jeremiah 13, verse 1. Each of these are from Bibles that we have here at Messiah.

- + <u>American Standard Version</u>: ¹Thus saith Jehovah unto me, Go, and buy thee a linen girdle, and put it upon thy loins, and put it not in water.
- + <u>English Standard Version</u>: ¹Thus says the Lord to me, "Go and buy a linen loincloth and put it around your waist, and do not dip it in water."
- + <u>New International Version</u>: 'This is what the Lord said to me: "Go and buy a linen belt and put it around your waist, but do not let it touch water."
- + <u>New Revised Standard Version</u>: 'Thus said the Lord to me, "Go and buy yourself a linen loincloth, and put it on your loins, but do not dip it in water."
- + <u>Good News Bible</u>: 'The Lord told me to go and buy myself some linen shorts and to put them on; but he told me not to put them in water.
- + <u>The King James Version</u>: 'Thus saith the Lord unto me, Go and get thee a linen girdle, and put it upon thy loins, and put it not in water.
- + <u>New Century Version (Youth Bible)</u>: 'This is what the Lord said to me: "Go and buy a linen belt and put it around your waist. Don't let the belt get wet."

One thing of note is the object which Jeremiah is told to buy. The original Hebrew word means "waist-cloth." In our translations we see the words girdle, loincloth, belt, and shorts. In Juniata County English the closest word from these texts is likely "shorts." We would more likely today use the word "underwear" since that is what Jeremiah is told to go out and buy.

You might be asking, "If the translation that I use personally is NOT in this list, should I go out and buy a Bible that is in this list?" **Absolutely NOT**! Truly wonderful is the fact that you have a preferred Bible which you read and study regularly! Reading and studying God's Word guides us always.

May we at Messiah resolve to follow the words and will of Christ our Savior. May we continue to serve others in need during times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. May we remain steadfast in our faith and in the Love of Jesus as we bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you.

May the Lord be with you all!
