THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

In Matthew 22, Jesus said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' and 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' These are the two greatest commandments. We are to follow these as primary teachings brought to us by Jesus, the same Jesus whose birth we celebrate this month.

In Matthew 24:36-44, the Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Advent, Jesus refers to his second coming. How can we prepare for this instant of the ages which neither angels nor Jesus know the time? While God's grace is given to us unconditionally, we are to be prepared as Jesus directs us. One look at Matthew 22 illuminates a path for us of compassion and love for our neighbor. This is a main theme of the message of the Christmas season. What are some ways in which you as the family of Christ at Messiah can share in this commandment?

One way is to put together in a box a Reverse Advent Calendar. You can find this list in the weekly Sunday bulletins and in this newsletter. You do this by putting in the calendar (the box) an item each day from December 1 through December 24. Christmas Eve and/or on Christmas Day, bring the box of goodies to the church. These gifts will be shared with those in need and will meet a post-Christmas need that will provide several meals. Check this out and fill the church at Christmas with Reverse Advent Calendars.

Another way of loving your neighbor this season is to fill the coin banks for the Shelter Service of Mifflin and Juniata Co. The director, Jane Neff spoke at Messiah at our Thank Offering service in November. She described many of the caring services offered to folks in Juniata, Mifflin, and Huntingdon counties. These benefits go beyond a room and extend to families in their times of need. Our Parish Planning Council has made the Shelter Services the mission of the month for December which means Messiah will match the amount donated up to \$1,000. Fill those coin banks and bring them in anytime in December.

Yet another way of caring for our neighbors is through our own "Project of Faith" fund. This fund grows every time you purchase a Weis or Giant gift card. Five percent of the face value of that gift card remains with Messiah and is used for benevolent projects near and far. These monies have helped victims of fires, helped with medical bills, and even shared through a Lutheran church in Gulfport Mississippi following Hurricane Katrina. This year, support will be provided to the Juniata County Food Pantry to help with meals at Christmas and beyond. Keep supporting this project by purchasing gift cards.

Let us at Messiah resolve to follow the words and will of Christ our Savior. Let us continue to serve others in need during times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. Remain steadfast in our faith in the Love of Jesus to bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you.


The 2023 church offering envelopes are now available to pick up in the church library. Please pick these up before or after Sunday morning services or stop by the church office during business hours to pick yours up!

- 1. The names of the 'Three Wise Men' are not mentioned in the Bible. They are commonly known as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar as these names were detailed in an early 6th century Greek manuscript.
- 2. The three Wise Men of the East, also called the Magi, are featured in the Bible story of the Nativity. The story of the Three Wise Men are detailed in the Bible in Matthew 2, 1-5; 7-15; 19-23.
- 3. The Three Wise Men presented the infant Jesus with three gifts which were fit for a king.
- 4. Gold as a symbol of kingship on earth, symbolizing virtue.
- 5. Myrrh (an embalming oil) was used as an anointing oil and as a symbol of suffering.
- 6. Frankincense was used as a perfume, symbolizing prayer and the priesthood.
- 7. Herod was the king of Judaea and sent the three wise men to Bethlehem.
- 8. Caesar Augustus was the name of the Roman Emperor who sent out a decree that all the world should be taxed.
- 9. The name of Joseph's city was Nazareth.
- 10. The other name for the city of David is Bethlehem.
- 11. The baby Jesus was wrapped in Swaddling clothes. This was a practice in Roman times when clothing and strips of fabric were wrapped about a baby to hold its arms and legs immobile, straightening and strengthening the body.
- 12. The infants who were slain under the orders of Herod were two years old and under.
- 13. Joseph and Mary went Egypt to flee from Herod.
- 14. The Star of Bethlehem was reported by Matthew, but at the same time Chinese astronomers recorded it, too.
