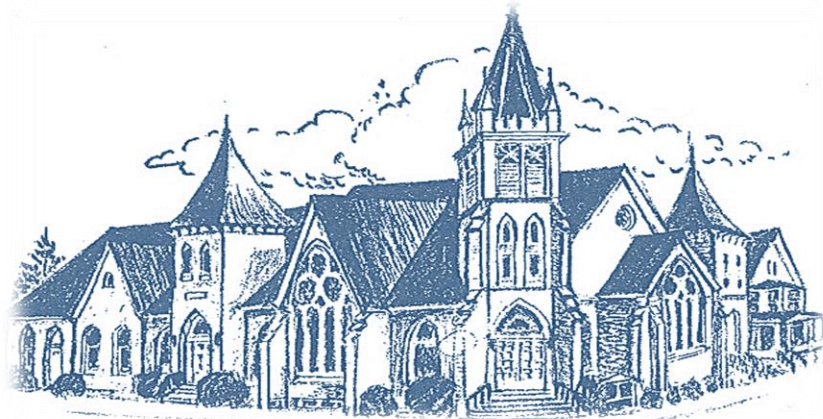

THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Messiah Family,

Christus natus est! Christ is born!

We celebrated the earthly birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And we continue to share the love and compassion which He demonstrated through his ministry in this world two thousand years ago. So, "another Christmas has come and gone," we say. We put away the decorations and set aside the song books. The music and atmosphere of the season pause for another year.

One of my favorite readings is the first chapter of the Gospel of John. The first verse states, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Jesus was in the beginning, Jesus was with God, and Jesus was God.

We just celebrated the earthly birth of the human Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God with us. Read again, "God with us," Emmanuel. God wasn't just with us when He was born in that stable and placed in the manger. God is with us today; Jesus is with us today; and the Holy Spirit is with us today.

Read the words of John aloud as they are printed in the present tense in this letter. **¹In the beginning, the Word is already here. The Word is with God, and the Word is God. ²He is with God in the beginning. ³All things are made through him. Nothing that is made is made without him. ⁴Life is in him, and that life is the light for all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness.**

As we set aside for another year the earthly trappings of the celebration of the earthly birth of Jesus, let us never put aside the love and compassion of Emmanuel, God with us, God IS with us!

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

Happy New Year! We are so thankful for all who shared their abundance with the Food Pantry during November and December. With your help we were able to provide over Thanksgiving and Christmas meals for neighbors who would have gone without. As we wind down our joyous celebrations of the holiday season, it's important to remember that for some folks this season has a different name: "The Season of Heat or Eat!" Many families this winter will have to choose whether to heat their homes or buy food and other necessities. Please continue to keep them in mind and in prayer as you pack away Christmas decorations and finish off leftovers.

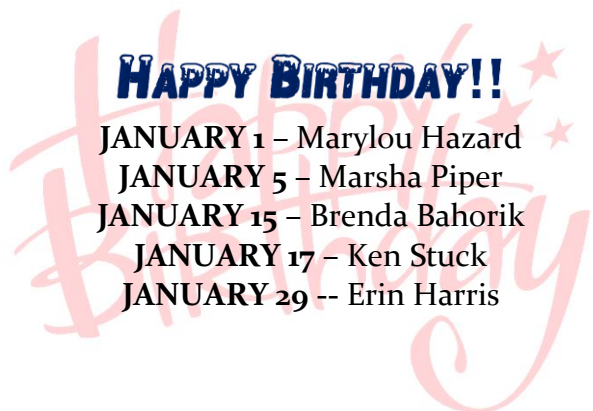

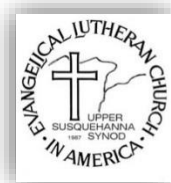

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!” When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.” So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. Luke 2:1-20

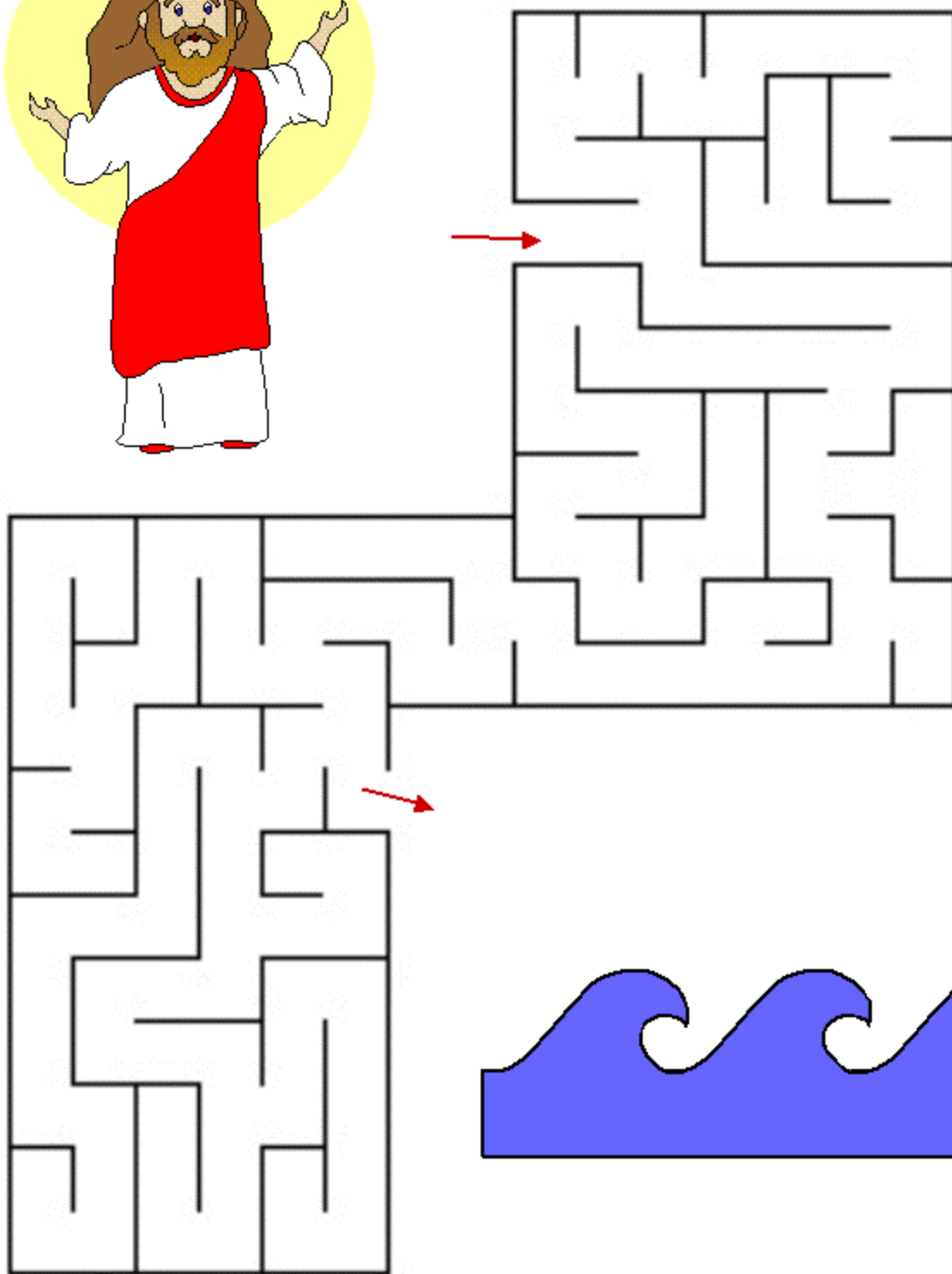
