We transition from Lent to Holy Week to the Passion of Christ to the Resurrection and Easter. Please join us Sunday morning, April 2 for the *"The Passion of Our Lord according to Matthew"* as read by the congregation and by the following individuals:

In addition, receive and celebrate with palm branches the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem.

Please join us again this year for a Maundy Thursday breakfast. This begins at 7:00 am Thursday April 6 in our Fellowship Hall. We begin this Eucharist meal with the breaking and sharing of bread as the Body of Christ. Our breakfast will consist of casseroles and other items. We finish our meal with the sharing of the Blood of Christ. Following our time at the meal, those who are able may join us as we remove the items from the altar in the sanctuary visually demonstrating the emptiness left through the crucifixion of Jesus on Friday.

On Good Friday we gather at 7:30 pm for a Tenebrae service. "Tenebrae" is the Latin word for "shadows." The Tenebrae service commemorates the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. The gradual extinguishing of the light symbolizes the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus, and the gathering darkness of the Crucifixion. At the close, one candle will remain lit to indicate that death only seems to triumph over Christ, who is the Light of the World. This service will include a combined choir with readers Andrea Cameron and Kevin Cunningham sharing the scriptures and prayers through the service.

The Resurrection of Our Lord is celebrated on Easter Sunday, April 9. There are two Gospel scriptures listed for this year's liturgy; they are Matthew 28:1-10 and John 20:1-18. Take some time to read these verses. How are they alike? How are they different? These will be a focus at our Bible study on April 11.

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!



HOW DO I BUILD A BUDGET?

REGISTRATION: Registration fees support the Gathering's programmatic, logistical and administrative operations. A \$150 deposit is required at the time of registration. A deposit is not required for MYLE or the Table. A limited amounted of money is set aside for assistance with registration fees.

HOTEL: We suggest that you budget about \$200/night for a room. Rooms assigned will be a variety of doubles, triples and quads so please budget for three to a room. Four nights of hotels at triple occupancy is approximately \$270 per person.

FOOD: This number can vary based on whether you bring breakfast foods and/or snacks, and whether you want fast food or sit-down meals or a combination. A good budget number would be \$40-60 / day for a total of \$200 - \$300 per person

TRAVEL: This number will vary based on the number of kids, whether you rent vans, rent a charter bus, or fly. etc...and of course the economy. (For the sample budget I put in \$400.00)

SHIRTS / MISC: I would budget \$50 person for shirts and random group goodies.

SO..... If you add a buffer and say the cost is \$1450/person you would have a little wiggle room.

Frequently Asked Questions



- I have never led a group and don't know where to start? We have lots of resources and experience and will walk you through every step of the process! We can provide power-points, handouts, fundraising ideas etc. The Gathering Website is a wonderful place to begin. The Gathering staff will also have on-line trainings for all leaders.
- We are not a wealthy congregation so how can we fund a Gathering? We understand and are happy to sit down with you and chat about your context and brainstorm ways to fund your trip. Maybe other churches in the area that have no current youth would be happy to help your youth. I cannot emphasize enough how important it is to start early. Both for fundraising and to build momentum.
- We have 3 or less youth and no adult chaperone, what do we do? Most of the conferences in the synod work together so I would suggest joining with another church from your conference would be a great way for the youth from your church to go.
- What is the Young Adult Gathering? Due to the cancellation of the 2022 Youth Gathering, many young people were not able to participate in these life-changing faith formation events. We are excited they are hosting the first-ever ELCA Young Adults gathering. This Gathering for young people who will be 18-35 at the time of the Gathering. We recognize that 18-35 is a wide age range and anticipate that most of our programming will be geared to 18-25 year olds. Programming and content are still being discerned. We do know that they will gather with the Youth Gathering each night for the Mass Gatherings. The Young Adult Gathering participants can NOT double at chaperones for the high school youth attending the Youth Gathering.
