The Pastors Ponderings

Dear Messiah Family,

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

I have seen a number of Bible translations and have been blessed to explore a few of them. The scripture readings each Sunday are from the New Revised Standard Version which is used by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. Below are several translations of 1 Samuel 24, verses 10-11(a). Each of these are from Bibles that we have here at Messiah.

- ➤ American Standard Version: ¹⁰ Behold, this day thine eyes have seen how that Jehovah had delivered thee to-day into my hand in the cave: and some bade me kill thee; but *mine* eye spared thee; and I said, I will not put forth my hand against my lord; for he is Jehovah's anointed. ¹¹ Moreover, my father, see, yea, see the skirt of thy robe in my hand; for in that I cut off the skirt of thy robe, and killed thee not,
- English Standard Version: ¹⁰ Behold, this day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you today into my hand in the cave. And some told me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, 'I will not put out my hand against my lord, for he is the Lord's anointed.' ¹¹ See, my father, see the corner of your robe in my hand. For by the fact that I cut off the corner of your robe and did not kill you,
- New International Version: ¹⁰ This day you have seen with your own eyes how the Lord delivered you into my hands in the cave. Some urged me to kill you, but I spared you; I said, 'I will not lay my hand on my lord, because he is the Lord's anointed.' ¹¹ See, my father, look at this piece of your robe in my hand! I cut off the corner of your robe but did not kill you.
- ➤ New Revised Standard Version: ¹⁰ This very day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you into my hand in the cave; and some urged me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, 'I will not raise my hand against my lord; for he is the Lord's anointed.' ¹¹ See, my father, see the corner of your cloak in my hand; for by the fact that I cut off the corner of your cloak, and did not kill you,
- ➤ **Good News Bible**: ¹⁰ You can see for yourself that just now in the cave the Lord put you in my power. Some of my men told me to kill you, but I felt sorry for you and said that I would not harm you in the least, because you are the one whom the Lord chose to be king. ¹¹ Look, my father, look at the piece of your robe I am holding! I could have killed you, but instead I only cut this off. This should convince you that I have no thought of rebelling against you or of harming you.
- ➤ The King James Version: ¹⁰ Behold, this day thine eyes have seen how that the LORD had delivered thee to day into mine hand in the cave: and some bade me kill thee: but mine eye

spared thee; and I said, I will not put forth mine hand against my lord; for he is the LORD's anointed. ¹¹ Moreover, my father, see, yea, see the skirt of thy robe in my hand: for in that I cut off the skirt of thy robe, and killed thee not,

New Century Version: ¹⁰ You have seen something with your own eyes today. The Lord put you in my power in the cave. They said I should kill you, but I was merciful. I said, 'I won't harm my master, because he is the Lord's appointed king.' ¹¹ My father, look at this piece of your robe in my hand! I cut off the corner of your robe, but I didn't kill you. Now understand and know I am not planning any evil against you.

In this passage, Saul feels threatened by David has been pursuing him in order to kill him. Even though Saul is delivered into David's hands, he does not harm Saul. The Bible lesson is that David's refusal to attack Saul isn't based on strategic or even moral grounds. It is based on the profound respect that David has for Yahweh – the fear of the Lord. God, David reasons, has put Saul into the kingship. For David, rebellion against Saul is tantamount to rebellion against the Lord himself who has anointed Saul. Take time to read through 1Samuel, chapters 24 through 28 to learn more about this time in David's life.

You might be asking, "If the translation that I use personally is NOT in this list, should I go out and buy a Bible that is in this list?" **Absolutely NOT!** Truly wonderful is the fact that you have a preferred Bible which you read and study regularly! Reading and studying God's Word guides us always.

May we at Messiah resolve to follow the words and will of Christ our Savior. May we continue to serve others in need during times of grief, sickness, loneliness, and struggles. May we remain steadfast in our faith and in the Love of Jesus as we bring to others consolation, attention, happiness, and the peace that passes worldly understanding. Share the message of hope with others around you.




