# The pastor's ponderings

Dear Messiah Family,

In John 10:10 Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

"Has the Church a message for the modern world?"

There are those who hold that this calls for a negative answer, that the church is obsolete, that the church is outgrown and that the world seeks and needs a ministry that the church does not supply. That way of answering the question must rest on one of two assumptions: either the church has forgotten her original message or that the ancient message is not adaptable to modern life and is therefore impactable, that modern life has developed situations and demands for which the church has no message.

Over our two thousand years of Christian discipleship, the message has shown definite adaptability throughout societies, cultures, and peoples. On the dark side, the message has been misused, abused, convoluted, and construed for selfish human gain, even by those who sincerely attempt bring the Gospel to others. This directs us to the first assumption, that the message has been forgotten, ignored, and passed over.

What then is the Christian message? In 2 Timothy 3:16-17 Paul writes "All scripture is ... useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." Not culture, but fitness for good work, this is our measure of the largeness of our lives; not what we get out of life, but what we put into life. The spirit of Christ dominant among us which has changed the position of women, the care and education of children, the treatment of prisoners, and the care of those most difficult to care for. To ruin modern life, you have only to take out of it what Christ has contributed to it.

These paragraphs are only a few thoughts and ideas from Chapter 14, *Has the Church a Message For the Modern World*, from the book University of Chicago Sermons, published in 1915. This volume is from the library of the late Rev. Dr. Paul W. DeLauter and is available upon request from yours truly.

During our current modern times of uncertainty, natural and man-made disasters, personal loss and struggles with health, and the constant fight to invent and develop new ways to bring God's Love and care to our neighbors, let us always refocus on the message of Christ to the worldly body of Christ – us, the children of God.

May the blessings of God the Creator, Jesus Christ our Lord, and The Holy Spirit be with you all!

# CHRISTMAS ANCELS THANK YOU!

Our program provided families from all over Juniata County clothing and gifts for 115 children this year. Once again, you have helped with clothing, toys, books, laundry detergent, whole turkeys and more for 43 families!

In 2020, we helped provide needed gifts to 83 children from 31 families. In 2022, 150 children from 48 families participated in the outreach. The need in our county is real and continues to grow. 125 children from 42 families were recipients of the outpouring of care in 2023.

Together with the Salvation Army of Juniata County and Aldersgate Church as sign-up partners, The Lions Club, Thrivent, Schlegel's Grocery, <u>hometownfoundation.org</u>, and over 35 sponsor programs and churches from all across Juniata County, we continue to meet the needs of our neighbors. This year the maximum age was decreased to accept children up to the age of 14. Each year is different, and your support may look different from year to year. Thank you for your flexibility and commitment.

Since the 1980's, this program would not be possible if it weren't for the sponsors! Thank you to the churches and individuals and group sponsors from every part of the county and denomination who so generously give each year....this could not happen without each of you!



The main reason for this particular message is to share that an Ash Wednesday Service *(including a number of Mifflintown area churches . . . with Port Royal Lutheran Parish and other churches' members certainly welcome to attend the Community Lenten Services)* will be held at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church and Kevin Cunningham has offered to direct a joint choir for the scheduled **Wednesday, March 5th (7:00 PM)** Ash Wednesday Service.

While Kevin already has three special choral selections in mind, he thought it wise to first determine the choir's roster numbers and part voicing before finalizing any plans. # SUMMER CAMP 2025






