# WHAT IS THE TRANSFIGURATION OF JESUS?

The Transfiguration of Jesus is a New Testament event where Jesus' appearance changed and became radiant while on a mountain with three of his disciples. The event is described in the Gospels of Matthew (Matthew 17:1–8), Mark (Mark 9:2–8), and Luke (Luke 9:28–36).

#### WHAT HAPPENED?

- Jesus took Peter, James, and John to a mountain to pray
- Jesus' face and clothes became dazzlingly bright
- Moses and Elijah appeared and spoke to Jesus about his upcoming death
- A voice from a cloud said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

#### WHY WAS IT SIGNIFICANT?

- It revealed Jesus' eternal glory, which was normally hidden during his life on earth
- It may have been an anticipatory appearance of Jesus' resurrection
- It may have signified Jesus' fulfillment of the Mosaic Law and the Hebrew Bible's prophecies

#### **HOW IS IT CELEBRATED?**

- The Feast of the Transfiguration is celebrated in the Lutheran Churches on the first Sunday preceding Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season
- It's considered a key milestone of Jesus' life and ministry


